
Dear Sir:

I have noted and herewith return the editorial appearing in the Houston Defender, under date of July 21, 1934. It seems to fit in with the resolutions which were passed by the Advisory Committee at the last meeting. I have taken the liberty of making some copies of this editorial for distribution to members of the Special Committee, now actively at work on hospital matters.

Mrs. Styron has been unable to get a date for a definite hearing with the officials until after the election. They have promised her a hearing at that time and she has informed them that after the election her Committee will "camp on their trail" until they get the hearing.

I feel that the Hospital is fortunate in enlisting Mrs. Styron's aid. She has spent much time there and among various doctors in familiarizing herself with its operation and problems. She advised me recently that Dr. Keeler, the pathologist at Hermann Hospital, had agreed to take over supervision and direction of the laboratory at the Houston Negro Hospital until it could provide its own force as originally contemplated. I am informed that Dr. Keeler is one of the best in her line in the city and that this action is a decided addition to the Hospital staff at this time.
