Dear Sir:

In accordance with your request over the telephone we revised our estimates on this proposition so as to figure on freezing 200# of ice-per 24 hours instead of 100#.


We found that the compressor had ample capacity for this extra duty but it was necessary to increase the ammonia condensers and the size of the motor. Also of course necessary to increase the size of the freezing tank, number of cams up to four and also the number of pipe in the freezing tank.

Our estimate showed that we could furnish this larger equipment to you for \$1584.00 delivered and erected on the same basis as the original proposition which was covered by our specifications dated January 12, 1926. In other words there was only a difference of \$189.00, for the additional ice making equipment. This also covers the automatically controlled plant.

In connection with increasing the ice making capacity we want to call attention to the fact that it may be necessary to operate the ice tank under manual control in order to get out the 200# of ice, because there is a possibility that the temperature in the storage room will be down to 35° before the ice is frozen and in that case the thermostat would shut down the ammonia compressor, so that if this happens then it will be necessary to by-pass the refrigerator and use the hand controls on the compressor in order to freeze up the ice, but we have figured very liberally on our ice tank coils with the idea of trying to have the ice frozen up in the shortest time possible.

If it is decided to put in this larger equipment we would be pleased to submit revised specifications on this for your approval.
