## The Inside Story

Community activist and Inklings bookstore co-owner Annise Parker will be running for a seat on Houston's City Council, for District C. Currently, the district extends from Montrose to Meyerland and Westbury. She will be facing a two term incumbent.

At the Starnite '91 outdoor fest which followed the Gay/Lesbian Pride Parade, Annise stated that other openly gay candidates have run for office in this city in the past. "Let's make this the first winning campaign!" she urged, adding "I don't even have a campaign headquarters yet, but I have a campaign phone. I will need your help in the next five months."

Her formal announcement for the seat will be July 2.

## GAY & LESBIAN ALLIANCE AGAINST DEFAMATION, INC.

### FUNDAMENTALISTS SPONSOR BOYCOTT

Donald Wildmon's American Family Association (AFA), an anti-gay fundamentalist group, has launched a national boycott campaign against what it calls the "top sponsors of pro-homosexual programs" on TV.

The AFA wages a constant campaign of intimidation against sponsors of TV programs that have aired episodes with gay and lesbian characters, including *thirtysomething*, *L.A. Law* and *Doctor, Doctor* (now on "hiatus"). In Wildmon's view, any program that presents gays and lesbians as "normal" is "promoting homosexuality." His intimidation of sponsors is one reason *there are currently no recurring gay or lesbian characters on any network program*. Even successful shows lose money when sponsors pull out.

Specifically, the AFA is calling for boycotts against S.C. Johnson and Pfizer, Inc. To counter their attack, write and support these advertisers. Write to Chrm. Samuel C. Johnson, S.C. Tell them gays and lesbians use their products, too!

### SYNDICATED HATE

Patrick Buchanan, despite his apparent respectability as a TV pundit, engages in fanatical ravings against gay men and lesbians. His purpose? To provoke anti-gay rage among his readers.

Recently, Buchanan's syndicated newspaper column condemned New York City Mayor David Dinkins for his "insult" to Catholics by "prancing

with sodomites" during New York's St. Patrick's Day parade. Railing against "the sewers of sodomy and lesbianism," Buchanan attempted to justify his bigotry as a legitimate form of prejudice, writing "a visceral recoil from homosexuality is the natural reaction of a healthy society wishing to preserve itself."

Last fall, Buchanan's column told readers that "Homosexual groups are attempting to mainstream Satanism... With 80,000 dead of AIDS, 3,000 more buried each month, our promiscuous homosexuals appear literally hell-bent on Satanism and suicide."

GLAAD believes strongly in freedom of the press. But we also believe that Buchanan's syndicator is making a choice when it publishes his untrue and bigoted rantings. Confront them on spreading prejudice and hate, and note that there are no nationally syndicated openly gay or lesbian columnists to provide balance. Also write NBC to complain about Buchanan's presence as a panelist on *The McLaughlin Group*, their Sunday morning discussion show. Following the St. Patrick's Day parade, Buchanan spewed his hate at "sodomites" who "insulted" the Catholic Church by their presence in the parade, and no one countered his view! And if Buchanan's column appears in your local paper, write or phone the editor whenever his hate-mongering appears.

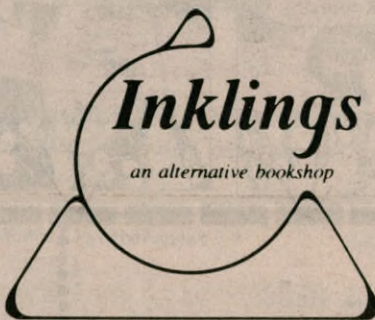
