









AN INVITATION TO WOMYN IN THE COMMUNITY

Five years ago, the vision of WOMYNSPACE was launched. The vision was framed by a collective of seven womyn based on input from several hundred womyn in the form of surveys.

During this time, WOMYNSPACE has offered workshops and retreats, classes and NOW - sponsored feminist consciousness raising, brunches and performances, 12-step meetings, and meeting space for various organizations. It has provided alternative chemical-free space to the womyn of the feminist community and housed traveling womyn and womyn in need of sanctuary.

Now, WOMYNSPACE is looking at the direction it wants to take, which values it wishes to uphold. As an organization, we are examining the process which has led us to this point. One of the things we must acknowledge is that, at times, the process has failed. It has done harm to womyn and alienated them. It is not the opinion of this writer that consensus, by and large, is a failure. Rather, in embracing consensus, we failed to acknowledge that there would still be a need for leadership. And that leadership, over the years, has emerged as personal hidden agendas. We also failed to acknowledge that, as Sonia Johnson said, in creating community, we all bring with us our internalized oppression. There is a third factor - one that I have fallen prey to over the last few years and have seen other womyn fall prey to as well. It is much easier to see what needs to be done and to expect someone else to do it, then criticize her (them) for not doing it. Given these three variables, the question now is: Can

WOMYNSPACE remain a viable organization in the community? If so, how?

There are womyn in the community who believe the answer is affirmative. Part of this will be accomplished by restructuring WOMYNSPACE, and part of it will be accomplished by re-establishing its credibility.

The leadership is in the Steering Committee. The function of the Steering Committee is to uphold the values of WOMYNSPACE and guide various committees in doing the same. The members of the Steering Committee at this time are Kathy W., Dorothy W., Margarette S., Erika L., Margarita D., Sammie C., and Peggy C. The Steering Committee is open to members who are willing to make a time commitment of no less than 6 months.

The values/purpose of WOMYNSPACE are these:

- independence
- openness to all womyn
- a feminist focus
- the staging of primarily womyn-only events
- operating via consensus, guided by Steering Committee
- offering of chemical-free space

It is the hope of the Steering Committee that womyn will feel compelled once more to actively participate in WOMYNSPACE. In participation, we must recognize the rights of womyn to dissent - the goal being clarity and understanding rather than chastisement of estrangement. It is time to transform process into action. Will you join us?






