### Sparkman Represents the South About as Much as We Do Harlem

With full knowledge of the stupidity and credulity of many Southerners, Fair Dealers at their Convention in Chicago threw out the hook baited with John J. Sparkman of Alabama.

It was immediately swallowed by a majority of Southern delegates who wanted a good excuse to continue to swill the slop from the administration trough, and jumped at this chance to save their face.

Sparkman is a Southerner simply by an accident of birth and has no more respect for the traditional rights of Southern States to settle their own affairs without Federal interference than Truman, Phil Murray or Alger Hiss.

He has opposed Civil Rights and FEPC legislation only because he would not last five minutes as a Sena-

tor from Alabama if he favored it.

In all other matters he has followed Roosevelt and Truman in their march toward State Socialism as blindly as if he had been at the end of a rope with a brass ring in his nose.

He not only voted for Federal ownership of the Texas Tidelands and put himself on record in favor of Federal seizure of private property but he joined with his Socialist colleague, Lister Hill, in demanding that the money from this property be divided between all the States on the Marxian principle of "taking from each according to his means and giving to each according to his need."

If he represents the interests of authentic Southern people, then we correctly reflect the sentiments of the citizens of Harlem.

### The Southern Delegations To Democratic Convention Fired A Blank Cartridge And Fell Flat On Their Faces

The poor showing made by Southern delegations at the Democratic National Convention at Chicago has been a let-down not only to the people of the South, but to those all over the nation.

We have had talks with, and communications from, scores of business executives, professional men, politicians and laymen, some of whom were at Chicago and they feel that this defection on the part of Southern delegates has effectively spiked efforts to oust the Fair Dealers in November.

Most of the Southern delegations were instructed in the primaries and State conventions of the party to oppose any platform at Chicago that advocated Civil Rights, FEPC and other Socialistic provisions and it was fully expected that this course would be followed by authorized delegates to the convention.

This was not true in states like Alabama and a few others who had already sold out to the Fair Deal, but in other States it was confidently believed that the delegations would do something more than just blow off steam.

There was a lot of pre-convention hot air and popping off in the press on the part of the delegates about what they would do to the Trumanites

### Will Truman Pardon Hiss As Roosevelt Pardoned Browder?

The suggestion has been made that perhaps Truman will pardon Alger Hiss in order that Hiss may campaign for his friend, Adlai Stevenson.

If he should do this, he would be breaking no precedent for Roosevelt pardoned Earl Browder so he could organize the Communists in support of the New Deal.

So they assembled their forces, stored up their ammunition and charged on Chicago.

But, in the showdown, they fired a blank cartridge and fell flat on their faces.

It was the opportunity which comes only once in a lifetime for a courageous group to take action which might put forces in motion that would have rescued their party from Socialism, but they fumbled the ball and lost the game.

Denial of their basic right to choose between two presidential candidates of directly opposing views on principles of government, has left them feeling like political orphans but there is some good that may be salvaged from the wreckage of the two great parties if the people will stop fighting, holding post-mortems and organizing futile splinter parties.

We have never known so many people to be so thoroughly alarmed over the State of the Union as at this good hour and we have been an observer of political reactions for a long time.

The general attitude, according to communications and practically tons of literature, from all sections of the country, is one of hopelessness, disillusionment and despair.

If we undertook to answer all letters anxiously inquiring if there is anything that can be done to stave off inevitable Socialism, we wouldn't have time to get out a paper.

By their own admission, most of them have let the situation rock along for years paying little or no attention as Roosevelt and Truman steered the ship of state toward the dangerous shoals of Internationalism and World Government as a replacement for our Constitutional Republic.

Now, at long last, with a belated sense of responsibility as citizens they are possessed of an over-powering fear that it is too late to beat back the on-rushing tide.

This fear stems from their earnest consideration of the two men nominated by the major political parties as candidates for president and their realization that neither fills the desperate need for a virile, outspoken and uncompromising champion of the principles which spell the difference between Americanism and the totalitarian type of government which has put the people of two-thirds of the earth in chains.

Primarily, they were dumbfounded at the manner in which Southern delegates to the Democratic Convention in Chicago let them down for vaguely, they seemed to consider that salvation lay in the development of strong Southern leadership at Chicago and a Southern revolt growing out of the convention which would serve as the nucleus of resistance to domination of the Federal government by unionneers and big city machine bosses.

When the Southern delegations meekly lay down, one by one, and let the CIO-Pendergast mob walk over them, that hope was gone and with it the chance for constructive and organized resistance to Trumanism corruption and National Socialism.

Not having tied our paper to the tail of the kite of any candidate or political party, and continuing to believe that the answer lies with Congress, and not the next president, we do not suffer the "lost orphan" feeling that pervades many hearts, but we certainly share their apprehension about the current situation where World Socialists are breathing down our necks and waiting to take over.

A Congressional Coalition saved us from total disintegration into National Socialism during Roosevelt's and Truman's administration and we refuse to concede that any more diabolical, scheming and unprincipled politician could ever occupy the White House than either of those two characters.

Many meetings have been held in various sections of the country concerning a Third Party movement and numerous splinter parties have been able to place candidates for president on the ticket in their respective States.

Any one with a knowledge of practical politics, however, is compelled to face the fact that these scattered and extraneous movements are futile in the present emergency.

Whether we like it or not—and most of us don't—either Dwight D. Eisenhower running on a so-called Republican ticket or Adlai Stevenson campaigning on a so-called Democratic ticket will be the next president of the United States and that is all there is to that.

To add to the tragedy and dash any hopes of those who hold that a president of the United States should be an unyielding partisan of his own country and dedicated primarily to its advancement, interests and well-being, the United Nations issued a press release following the Democratic Convention which said:

"The nomination of Governor Adlai Stevenson of Illinois was generally welcomed today by United Nations delegates . . . The selection

## Federal Government Employs 50,000 Press Agents To Cover Up Truman's Mistakes

"This was because they were honest and didn't do anything to be ashamed of and didn't have anything to hide."

of Mr. Stevenson together with the nomination of Dwight D. Eisenhower as the Republican candidate, was taken as an assurance that, whoever was elected, the basic foreign policy of the United States would continue to follow the pattern fixed by President Truman . . . It means that our next Chief Executive must divide his allegiance equally between the interests of the industrious taxpayers of the United States and the welfare of shiftless mendicants of foreign lands.

This is evidence that our accepted foreign policy for the next four years is based on the Marxian philosophy of "taking from each according to his means and giving to each according to his needs."

It is a sad day in the history of a nation when the people in selecting their leader, are forced to choose the lesser of two evils but, Brother, that's just exactly where we are in this year of our Lord, 1952.

It is a fundamental right of the American people to have two candidates for president who represent opposite political ideologies and in these perilous times with the future of the Republic hanging in the balance, it is doubly essential that we enjoy this prerogative.

We should be able to choose between a candidate who believes in Constitutional government without equivocation or exception; who boldly denounces corruption in government, including infiltration of Communists and domination by labor unions or any other group or class; who is unalterably opposed to Socialism as embodied in the United Nations and who is alert to the danger to our sovereignty by any subversive world group; who is outspoken in defense of the rights of the States to conduct, without any outside interference, the internal affairs of the people including their social customs, employment practices and any other rights granted to them by the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

We should, on the other hand, have the chance to vote for a candidate who represents the opposite principles and who advocates State Socialism as promulgated by Roosevelt and Truman for twenty years.

This opportunity is not to be granted us for both candidates hold such similar views on many vital issues that they might as well be cross-filed on both tickets.

We have said often and we repeat that we endorse no candidate. Our candidates will be those Conservative Democrats and Republicans in Congress who, we believe, will continue in the future as they have in the past, to save us from total and complete Socialism.

Although we endorse no candidate, we do not hesitate to give our honest opinion of the muddled and confused situation in answer to the hundreds who have written us on the subject.

Those who have no candidate for president whom they can conscientiously support could, it seems to us, at least try to salvage one thing from the wreckage and that would be to kick the Fair Deal gang out of Washington even if, at the same time, they feel they are swapping the Devil for the Witch.

There are millions of the younger generation who do not believe that there can be any such thing as another party being placed in control of government, for they have never seen it done.

To prove that a change in the name of the party in power can be made, is something and would be a short step in the right direction and maybe, we could go on from there with the hope of a real American president in another four years.

But the good doctor had reckoned without a tall Texan in his audience who, with his wife, was also a passenger on the Queen Mary and who sat and listened courteously to the same hot line he had heard so many times before and which he had so often successfully shot to pieces in countless forums throughout the country.

Homer Tomlinson of Fort Worth is so familiar with the tricky, ambiguous and misleading provisions of the United Nations Charter and of those of its various auxiliary organizations, that he can practically recite them backwards.

For every vague, illusory and specious argument advanced in favor of the United Nations as an effective force for world peace, he can produce limitless factual, authoritative and documented proofs to the contrary.

When Dr. Korn had finished, Mr. Tomlinson arose and gave the true picture of the United Nations' implications and potentialities which provided the lounge lizards of the luxury liner some constructive and illuminating information, as well as some unscheduled diversion.

We don't know what he said but we would give a lot to have heard him say it for he is one of this generation's soundest thinkers and most brilliant speakers.

## Lattimore Praises Success Of Soviet Policies

In the report of the McCarran Committee of Congress on the Insitute of Pacific Relations, a notorious Communist-inspired organization which helped shape American foreign policy some years ago, there are hundreds of pages of testimony by and about Owen Lattimore.

Just one small excerpt, however, from Exhibit No. 539 in that report will give an idea of Mr. Lattimore's sentiments on Russia.

The excerpt is from an article, or survey, written by Lattimore August 23, 1944:

"On many occasions during a brief recent journey through the Soviet Far East and Central Asia, I was struck by the obvious success of the Soviet policy toward its minority peoples, and by the international importance of this policy. The essentials of the Soviet method are simple. The Russians work by removing legal, social and economic obstacles to the progress of minority peoples and 'backward' peoples. These peoples are then free to work out their own progress according to their own capacities. The method is anything but paternalistic. Because the people work out their own progress, they feel that everything which they accomplish is their own, not something charitably bestowed on them..."

Mr. Lattimore's portrayal of Russia as a Utopia might astound some of Stalin's slaves if they were privileged to read anything except State newspapers but his preference for the Russian economy over that of his own country is no news to those of us who have had his number for a long time.

## Hiring And Firing Is Solely The Employer's Business

The Gallup poll announces that a large majority of Americans favor fair employment practices handled and controlled on a State level instead of by the Federal government.

The pollsters claim to have made a canvass of a cross-section of American people and to have found out that this is the majority opinion.

Well, we don't think it should be handled by either and if the Gallup people had asked their question in the right manner, they would probably have found that many others feel the same way.

Who an employer hires is his own business and strictly his own business unless we are willing to concede that this is no longer America and that we have already adopted methods of totalitarian states, in the conduct of our business.

An American employer should be able to hire and fire any person he wants to and neither the State nor Federal government have any legitimate right to any say-so whatever in the matter.

Stevenson's action, so far, indicates that he is going to proceed along the line of his two immediate predecessors and treat the people as if they were stupid dopes—which they too often are. He condemned the tendency toward centralization of power in Washington. At Houston he said he favored the States taking action on FEPC legislation but if they didn't the Federal government should step in and see that they did. Some States Righter, he is. He is against concentration of power in the Federal government and for States Rights so long as the several States do what the president wants them to do. When they show any independence, he is for bringing Federal power to bear on them.

## Texas Makes Gains In Our National Congress

The election of Martin Dies as Congressman at large and Price Daniel to the United States Senate has greatly cheered the people of Texas who see in these two victories a definite evidence that the forces for Constitutional government have been materially strengthened.

Carefully segregating union labor leaders and other minority groups into a sacred clan designated by Divine Providence as the exclusive beneficiaries of a bountiful government, he lashed out at all other Americans as representatives of "selfish interests."

With a flash-back to his "give-'em-hell" tactics in 1948, and a few details about how he wowed 'em during his trips to the tank towns, he wound up with a prophetic warning which brought his cheering audience to its feet:

"We did it in 1948. We will do it again in 1952 and make 'em like it."

But alas! His elation was short-lived and did not long survive his speech for it was only a short while until Adlai Stevenson came along and pulled the rug out from under him.

He told the president, in effect, that administration approval constituted the kiss of death and that he, himself, would do most of the talking.

So, it looks like the venomous, vindictive and vitriolic tongue of the little man in the White House has been practically silenced and that he has made his last whistle-stop and delivered his last "give-'em-hell" oration.

Senator McCarthy's record and Adlai Stevenson's record on the subject of subversives are the extreme opposites.

## Stevenson Comes Out Of A Huddle With A Plan For Working Both Sides Of The Street

When Governor Adlai Stevenson accepted the Fair Deal nomination, he was caught between a shiver and a sweat.

The obscure and unknown candidate realized that he could not be elected without the support of the Truman political machine composed jointly of the Pendergast underworld forces and Washington government agency heads whose combined strength provides an effective instrument for enabling Socialist Democrats to have and to hold the presidency forever.

## Stevenson Follows The Truman Pattern In Insults To Texas

Stevenson's admission that he will, if elected, uphold the Tidelands steal, ties him in irrevocably with the present administration and makes any further attempt to disassociate himself from Truman corruption absolutely laughable.

## Truman Is A Roughneck Socialist With A Missouri Twang Stevenson Is A Polished Socialist With A Harvard Accent

Before we take Mr. Adlai Stevenson's attitude of modesty and self-deprecation too seriously, we should remember that Harry Truman was humble too when honors for which he, also, was "physically, mentally and temperamentally" unfitted, were thrust on him.

The sickening adulation and flattery of the parasites and sycophants in his entourage set up a chain reaction in his limited thought processes which ultimately convinced him of his invincibility as a supreme dictator of political, economic and social policies of the American people.

Since Missouri is a two-party State, the winner will not be decided until November when it is generally expected that the present Republican incumbent will retain his seat, but the vote shows that even the Missourians are fed up with Trumanism.

## Promoting Communism Is Education Promoting Americanism Is Propaganda

The Cox investigating Committee of Congress is going into the affairs of the large Foundations, such as Rockefeller, Ford, Carnegie, Rosenwald and others and it's high time.

The McCarran Committee has already brought out evidence that some of these tax-exempt groups are devoting their time and money to the promotion of un-American activities by giving scholarships and grants to Communists and other subversive persons.

The policy of the Federal government taxing authorities is that if any group is engaged in the promotion of Communism, they are doing educational work and thereby tax-exempt, but if they are fighting Communism and promoting Americanism, it is propaganda and no tax-exemption is allowed.

## Truman's Frame-Up Against Farmers in 1948 Exposed

In a recent article in the Saturday Evening Post, it was brought out through documented evidence and records dug up by Senator John Williams of Delaware, that Harry Truman deliberately misrepresented facts to Midwest farmers in 1948 and indulged in trickery which tilted the election results in his favor.

Just before election day and when it was too late for the actual facts to be assembled and offered in rebuttal, he made a trip to Midwest States and told farmers that the 80th Congress had passed legislation preventing the Department of Agriculture from providing storage facilities for the grain crop. This, he said, caused the farmers to have to dump their corn on the market regardless of prevailing prices.

Senator Williams has produced evidence and had it incorporated in the Congressional Record showing that the Department of Agriculture deliberately sold thousands of portable storage bins which they already had on hand and which were ample to store the 1948 crop.

He also has uncovered evidence that the administration deliberately stopped buying corn for six weeks prior to the election in order to reduce the market price of that product.

When the farmers of the principal agricultural States were becoming panicky as a result of this mysterious and unexpected drop in prices, Truman went among them making speeches in which he falsely placed the blame on the 80th Congress, knowing, at the same time, that he had deliberately manipulated the deal himself.

We have occasionally had incompetent presidents and even those who surrounded themselves with crooks, as in the Harding administration, but, so far as we know, no Chief Executive before in our history has been so unprincipled and politically immoral as to personally enter into a conspiracy to cheat, mislead and misinform a great segment of the American people.

Harry Truman says that the drubbing the people of Missouri gave his candidate for Senator in the Missouri primaries, Buck Taylor, was not a slap at him. If they had nominated Taylor, however, he would have been the first to accept the verdict as a complete endorsement of himself and his policies. There is nothing like having a hide like a rhinoceros which is impervious to all expressions except those one wants to receive.

## The Whole United States Is In The "Disaster Area"

Secretary of Agriculture Brannan who never overlooks a chance to spend money where it will do the most good in keeping the Fair Deal in power, and himself in office, declared several States of the South as a "disaster area" because of recent droughts.

Having done this, he proceeded to pour money into the districts because there is a lot of fear on the part of the administration that the people of the South are disgusted and fed up, regardless of what Southern politicians say.

We would like to remind Mr. Brannan that in designating any one State or group of States as a "disaster area", he is discriminating against the rest of the country.

The whole United States is in a "disaster area" and has been for twenty years. The greatest national disaster ever suffered was when we permitted chuckle-headed chiselers like Truman, Brannan, et al to take over.

Adlai Stevenson said before his nomination as candidate on the Democratic ticket for president that he was not qualified for the job. He said he was physically, mentally and temperamentally unfit for the position. We hope that the majority of Americans agree with his own analysis of himself. Jimmy Davis, former governor of Louisiana, is an exception to this rule.

Jimmy was never any "great shakes" as a statesman and was always more interested in a song than he was in principles of government, even when acting as the Chief Executive of a great Southern State.

Now that the responsibilities of State no longer rest on his shoulders, he is making recordings of Western songs.

Having been born in ranch country and being possessed of a weakness for Western music, we often listen to him on the radio and the thought occurs to us that perhaps he is smart to be singing sweet melodies instead of working hard to try to save a country which, apparently, doesn't want to be saved.

## The Return of Dies

One of the less-cheering developments from the standpoint of New Dealers and "liberals" fond of viewing "McCarthyism" with alarm is that Martin Dies is going back to Congress. The former Texas congressman, who was chairman of the House committee on un-American activities, swept the Democratic primary for congressman at large from Texas. He came so close to obtaining a majority in the seven-man race that the runner-up has given up. Dies ran almost 380,000 votes ahead of him.

Unlike a great many others, Mr. Dies never had any illusions about communism. He recognized it as an implacable, deadly enemy to everything America represented. Far from giving way to the illusions that "tempted" others to betrayal, he fought communism wherever he saw it. He was right from the beginning, and his election vindicates him.—Washington, D. C., Times Herald.

## MY NIGHT

By the Editor

Last night at a session of Amalgamated Countries I was deeply impressed by a report on the progress made by a group of young scientists whose long-range objective is to bring about uniform atmospheric temperatures and unvarying weather conditions in all countries of the world.

My concern in this particular experiment perhaps stems from the intense interest my husband often expressed in this subject.

It was always his feeling that the inequality in climatic conditions in various sections and countries was evidence of discrimination on the part of nature against unfortunate people who were financially unable to go South in Winter and to the seashore in Summer.

He suffered keenly because of this injustice against underprivileged persons who must endure the extremes of heat and cold instead of being permitted to enjoy mild and even temperatures throughout the year.

I am sure that it was always his intention to eventually take action to correct this unequal distribution of natural resources and I feel he would approve the efforts of these young scientists to solve the problem.

I have no scientific knowledge, of course, which would enable me to understand the formula which will be followed but I have no doubt that these great scholars from every country in the world will eventually develop a universal climate acceptable to all.

This undertaking is being carried on under the auspices of Amalgamated Countries Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization and while this particular project is of the greatest importance, its full benefits may not be available for several years.

On the other hand, the educational program of ACESCO is so far advanced that it is already widely recognized as the dominating factor in the planning of the curricula and the selection of text-books in many public school systems throughout the country.

The educational program of ACESCO is under the direction of Dr. Ima Redd, an eminent educator and who is recognized as one of our greatest authorities on Progressive Education and on the proper processing of young school children for global citizenship.

It has been my privilege to serve on committees with Dr. Redd and I marvel at her grasp of the intricate problems involved in ACESCO's great undertaking whose objective is to divert the minds of American school children from a nationalistic viewpoint and direct them toward global ideals.

It is Dr. Redd's conviction that school authorities should have almost complete control of a child's training from kindergarten on through college. Her program includes summer camps for the children soon after the close of the regular term in order that they may be thrown in the company of their parents as little as possible.

She feels that in this way they are not exposed to narrow home influences which might retard their development as future world citizens.

Such nonsense as the singing of national anthems and participation in patriotic exercises is not tolerated and any show of deference to the American flag is strictly prohibited.

I have visited some of the schools which have adopted Dr. Redd's educational methods and I have been delighted at the results.

While the pupils in these schools may be somewhat deficient in spelling, arithmetic, history, geography and other unessential subjects, it was heartening to find young boys and girls of ten and twelve who were thoroughly versed in matters of sex and who could discuss a vital subject like birth control with complete understanding, assurance and poise.

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# Personal Reflections on the National Democratic Convention in Chicago

After watching the performance of the keynoter, Paul Dever of Massachusetts, it was easy to believe the whispered rumor that his selection for the job had been privately engineered by the Republicans.

Like a bull in a china shop who slobbers on everything he can't break, Dever threw his weight—all three hundred pounds—all over the place and offered profuse insults to the South as perspiration trickled down over two or three of his chins.

He got so exercised and wrought up that he completely lost his voice but not soon enough.

Blair Moody a mediocre newspaper man who was appointed to the United States Senate from Michigan by an even more mediocre personality, Governor "Soapy" Williams, revelled in the spotlight afforded by convention facilities.

Rarely have we witnessed an instance of a little man striving so hard for, or enjoying so thoroughly, his brief chance for a place in the sun.

At times it was difficult to decide whether the occasion was a national convention of a political party or a Roosevelt clambake.

The second night was Old Home Week. The joint was jumping as Roosevelts crawled out of the woodwork and swarmed all over the place.

In true Rooseveltian tradition, they hogged the spotlight, pranced and preened all over the podium and gave the public a treat by flashing buck teeth at the television camera.

Jimmy Byrnes' valiant stand against attempts to force the South Carolina delegation to take the "pledge of loyalty" to Fair Deal corruption almost tempted one, to forgive him for his former association with the gang but his wavering attitude after he returned home, cancelled out any admiration for his performance in Chicago.

Ordinarily women speakers at political conventions give out with the same tonal quality which is achieved by ripping a strip of bed-ticking and

the gravel-voiced dames with the poodle-dog hair-do's at Chicago were no exception.

The one who gagged us most—next to you know who—was India Edwards, the lantern-jawed lady chairman of the Womens Division who has acquired a permanent chip on her shoulder, probably as a result of having to constantly defend the misdeeds of her masculine superiors.

As she began her speech and found no one paying any attention, she grabbed the gavel and whammed it down like a blacksmith pounding an anvil.

After she had delivered a vigorous tongue-lashing to the audience, she stepped back, assumed a belligerent stance and glared.

Watching her, one got the impression that, just for a little, she would haul off and spit through her teeth.
