One of our committees ^{of volunteers} is going down to the
Police Courts to see Cases of brought in &
booked - then we shall follow them
through

Their trials the next morning and shall
see where they are sent to be punished,
we feel that before we can do anything
to better conditions, we must see just
what is being done now, we are
asking for 12 police women, but I have
an idea that the volunteers will worry
the politicians the most.

I was asked to tell my idea today on
Children's markets, City & Country Children
to work together, and sell garden produce
at the nearest City School Saturdays. Chil-
dren to run the selling and all.

Will you be kind enough to send as
soon as you can a list of all our contribu-
tors with sums given. as I wish to send out
some brief "Thank you" Cards. If Miss Roberts
has this list I have tried to reach her at
Dallas by telegram. With all good wishes
