### Ch. 13 Praises Shell Fire-Fighters

She pointed out in her report that there were no serious injuries from the incident which was caused by a piping failure in a furnace outlet line at the Hydrogen Desulfurization Unit in Aromatics-East. She emphasized that the "fire was handled very competently by Shell fire fighters."

On the five o'clock news report when Doug Murphy asked Jan, "If those things (industrial fires) get out of hand, they do have some problems. Don't

they?" Jan responded, "They do, Doug, but these firefighters are trained to handle all types of chemical fires, and I was impressed."

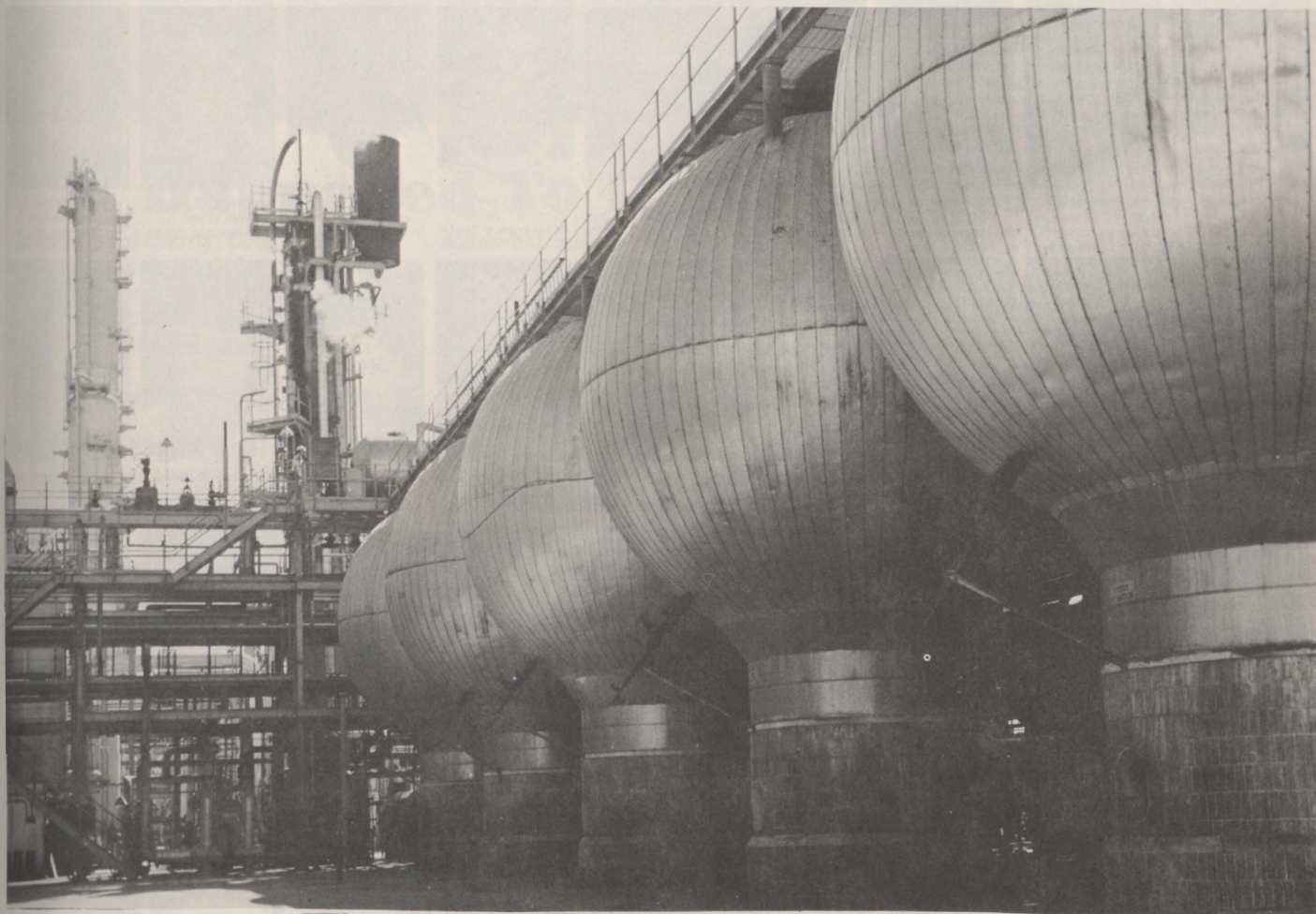
### EPA Praises Professionalism And Courtesy

## Environmental Expenditures Survey Report

Oil companies participating in an American Petroleum Institute survey have reported spending about \$2.3 billion on environmental protection during 1976.

In its seventh annual report entitled "Environmental Expenditures of the Petroleum Industry, 1967-1976," API notes that the companies have had combined environmental expenditures of \$11.3 billion for the 10-year period ending in 1976. Last year's outlays, the

report shows, were about \$250 million higher than those of 1975.

The data for the report were compiled by the accounting firm of Haskins and Sells. The Institute pointed out that the expenditure cited in the report does not represent total industry spending on pollution controls. The report was based on questionnaires sent to member API companies only and the National Petroleum Refiners Association.
