The Senate met at 7:10 p.m. in the World Affairs Room in the University Center, and the meeting was called to order by the President.

Eighteen Senators were present, with the following Senators absent: RON BLACKARD, BRAD CLEMENTS, CYRIL COLLISTER, PHIL DAGASTINO, BUTCH GREENE, MARILYN HARRIS, JOHN GREENE, JAMES SAXE, JIM TANNER.

SENATE JOURNAL

The minutes were approved as reported.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

President MATTERN reported that there will be an orientation for new Senators and Student Association officers. This Procedure Program is going to be held in the Honors Hall Room, University Center, from 3 to 5 p.m.-- refreshments will be served.

The President reported that the Senate will consider two appointments to the Orientation Steering Committee. The Orientation Steering Committee has already considered these people and referred them to the Senate for approval. The two people under consideration by the Senate are Vicki Kasmiroski and Mike Smith.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The first order of business was the consideration of Vicki Kasmiroski and Mike Smith to the Orientation Steering Committee. Due to the Orientation Committee's recommendation the Senate voted to approve.

Mr. HANCOCK requested that Senate Committees meet this week to consider legislation in committee since next week's meeting will be the last Senate meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Miss LOGAN called for the resignation of Jim Evans, Attorney General, in order for Mr. Evans not to be able to serve as Attorney General in his upcoming court trial.

Mr. Evans replied that he had no attention in defending his suit, and that someone from the Student Defenders or otherwise qualified will serve as acting Attorney General.

Mr. O'QUINN said that the UH Basketball team will play two games in Kansas this week end and requested that the Senate consider granting the cheerleaders \$500. to attend the games. He said that the request was a valid one since the cheerleaders would be on school business and represent the student body.

Mr. DRISCOLL moved to suspend the rules to entertain the previous request. The motion was seconded and passed.

President MATTERN said that Student Association does have the money, but it may have to be taken from some other account.

Mr. O'QUINN moved that \$500 be given to the UH Cheerleaders for the purpose of making a trip to Kansas for the Basketball Play-Offs and that all money not spent be returned to Student Association.

Miss BRATTIS said that the \$500 would only be spent for travel expenses and that food and lodging may be provided for by Coach Lewis.

Mr. POSTON disagreed with the motion saying that too much money would be spent.

Mr. DRISCOLL said that the money should be granted to the cheerleaders as long as there is enough money provided for in the Treasury.

Mr. GREENE of Arts & Sciences moved the previous question which failed.

Mr. WOOD moved to amend the motion to grant \$250 for four cheerleaders. The motion was seconded but failed.

Mr. PICKLE called question on the motion which passed.

The Senate voted on the motion to grant the UH Cheerleaders \$500 for the purpose of sending them to the UH Basketball game in Kansas which passed.

Mr. POSTON voted against the motion and Mr. WOOD abstained from voting.

Mr. O'QUINN introduced S. 42 (A BILL TO ESTABLISH PROCEDURE FOR STUDENT ASSOCIATION PARTICIPATION IN THE DEVISING OF CRITERION FOR UNIVERSITY WIDE AWARDS) which was referred to the Committee On Student Life, and S.R. 17 (A RESOLUTION THAT THE TOP TEN AWARD SHOULD BE DETERMINED BY THE CRITERION ESTABLISHED IN THE WHO'S WHO BILL) which was referred to the Committee On Student Life.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

President MATTERN asked all Committee Chairman to meet with their Committees in order for all legislation to be reported out by the last Senate meeting next week.

Mr. POSTON announced that the Committee On Fiscal & Governmental Affairs would meet after the Senate meeting.

Mr. O'QUINN moved to suspend the rules for the purpose of introducing a motion. The motion was seconded and passed with a vote of 16 in favor and 3 against.

Mr. O'QUINN moved to amend the Senate Rules of Procedure to comply with the Constitution. The amendment would come under Rule VII, Section K to read: "Legislation shall be considered by the Senate only during the Session in which it was introduced. A Session shall be defined as beginning the first Monday of April and ending the last day of March." The amendment was seconded and passed.

Mr. GREENE of Arts & Sciences announced that the Committee On State, National & International Affairs would meet on March 16, at Noon.

President MATTERN announced that the Executive Committee would meet next Monday from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Cox moved that the meeting adjourn. The motion was agreed to; and (at 8:00 p.m.) the Senate adjourned.
