I have estimated cost of work as follows:

( The fence is estimated to be of cedar posts,  
12 ft. centers, with three strands of barbed wire. )

The Live Oak trees are three year old stock,  
6 ft. high, 1 in. to 14 in. diameter. No estimate was  
made for additional shrubbery at gates.

The present concrete gate posts are beginning  
to topple over (one is already broken off at base), mak-  
ing it impossible to close the gates properly. This is  
caused by insufficient foundation and no reinforcing steel.  
The only remedy is to remove the old posts and rebuild  
them properly. This will cost \$110.00. 2
