This owns receipt of your communication of March 25th, all of which has been carefully noted, and I trust that as a result of the separate deliberations of the City Council and the Commissioners' Court at the next meeting a sound proposal will be adopted that will utilize all of the existing facilities without adding further burdens to the taxpayers at this time.

If there is any doubt on the part of any of our local officials of the urgent necessity for adopting such policy they should study what is going on in the metropolitan district of New York presently, which, judging from the occasional articles appearing in the press and from what I am hearing through direct correspondence, the citizens are now almost on the verge of revolution in agitating for relief and in declining to pay their assessments; a point that I have been mentioning to you and others for months as a result of information received from correspondents who have made a study of their tax situation and the impossibility of its being met without resulting in confiscation of all property and wealth not invested in tax-free securities or supported by monopolies of one kind or another.
