Sign up if you would like to receive mail in any of the feminist interest areas listed on this registration form. Grassroots women's organizations will then be able to mail to you to keep you informed about feminist events, actions, publications, and services.

By filling out the registration form, you alone determine what kind of organization and/or individuals can mail to you. You will only receive mailings in those areas you have designated, and only from organizations whose characteristics you have authorized. Your wishes will be absolutely respected.

What kind of mail will you receive?

Depending upon what interest area you selected, you will be hearing from any or all of the following:

- Women's literary, art, scholarly, and political magazines and journals
- Women's publishing houses
- Producers and distributors of women's music
- Political groups working on progressive feminist issues
- Announcements of spiritual retreats
- Non-traditional worker's organizations, networks and publications
- Tours for women, including wilderness expeditions and tropical paradises
- AND MUCH, MUCH MORE...

Look for the initials "NWML" on your mailing labels to know what is coming to you as a result of your participation in this network.

Registration Cost: This is an unfunded grassroots project which depends upon donations from the women who participate in the network. A donation of \$3.50 will pay for the costs associated with processing your registration form. If you cannot afford to donate, please fill out and return the registration form anyway. It is crucial that all women participate in a network that serves women's needs.

The Moral Majority can mail to over 5 million of their supporters. Feminists, too, must have this capability. Donations of \$10-\$25 will help pay for the urgently needed publicity to enable the network to reach its target of 100,000 participants by the end of 1990, and to continue growing to 1 million.






