Gentlemen:

During the year 1926, under dates of May 8th by letter and May 12th by telegram, you submitted a proposition on a memorial tablet to be placed on the first building erected for the Houston Negro Hospital. Your proposition was accepted; you later furnished and the tablet was appropriately placed.

Another building is now being constructed for which a second tablet is desired. The wording determined for this follows:

ERECTED IN MEMORY OF
LUCIE HALM CULLINAN
1862 - 1929

This tablet is to be placed on the east wall of the sally-porte.

The building is to be dedicated on June 19th. I would now like that you prepare and submit your ideas of a design and the estimated cost.

I assume that regardless of size and reduced wording, the same bronze and a similar border would be used as applied to the first. Please advise on this point. I am enclosing herewith prints showing the grounds and the new building, which I would thank you to return when they have served your purpose.

I will appreciate your prompt attention and advice as above, and further, how soon after the order is placed the tablet can be shipped.
