

School.


The class project was undertaken primarily to provide a situation in which the techniques and

COAST GUARD LCDR PHAUP TOURS DOCK FACILITIES




A week-long tour of the Shell dock facilities was part of a six-month, port safety training program established by the Coast Guard to acquaint port officers responsible for the development, administration, interpretation and enforcement of port safety regula-

tions with a better knowledge and understanding of the many complexities involved in operating a commercial port. The training program is designed to provide Coast Guard officers, such as LCDR J. L. Phaup pictured (on the left) with training coordinator E. O. "Ace" Goodson, an avenue for gaining some understanding of these complexities and how regulatory decisions made by the Coast Guard affect that facility.

After an introduction to the complex by C. G. "Andy" Anderson, Ace took LCDR Phaup on a tour of our dock facilities. They then visited interrelated departments, such as Shipping, the laboratory, Oil Movements and the tank farm control house.

LCDR Phaup is given the grand tour of the dock facilities and inter-related departments by training coordinator Ace Goodson.


retirees," says Iris, who worked at the Houston Refinery for 24 years before transferring to the Information Center in 1966.


SHELL CHILDREN HONORED AT AWARDS BANQUET



