## DPMC super donors honored in Blood Drive ceremony

Earl Malkie, pumper-gauger in Dispatching Operations' tank farm, and Jack Calloway, instrument technician, Maintenance South, have donated more than 15 gallons of blood between them!

Individual totals: Malkie, nine gallons and five pints (or 77 pints), and Calloway, six gallons (48 pints).


Recognition of this phenomenal record came to Malkie and Calloway last Friday at a ceremony attended by representatives of the Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center as well as Complex management. The super donors were presented special certificates and coffee mugs by Complex Manager Bill Thompson.

This presentation was part of a program developed and sponsored by the Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center to recognize outstanding donors. Certificates and mugs were also awarded to DPMC donors who have given three gallons (one person), two gallons (five people), and one gallon (103 people).

These awards are a curtain-raiser to the Fall 1982 DPMC Blood Drive, which will be held November 1, 2, 3 and 5 on the South side, and November 8-11 North.

Earl Malkie traces his astounding nine-gallon, five-pint record to Coast Guard service back in 1965. He would get the afternoon off by donating blood in the morning. "They called it 'vampire liberty,'" Malkie remembers with a smile.

Malkie, a husky 205-pounder who stands 6 feet, two inches tall, has been donating blood every eight weeks, the minimum

waiting period between donations, since he came down here from Painesville, Ohio in 1977, the year he joined Shell.

Why does he donate so often?

"I feel good about it," he responds, adding, "I believe in donating blood as something everyone can do, with very little effort, to help society."


What about discomfort?

"It doesn't bother me at all," Malkie in-

sists. "I know all the ladies at the Pasadena Blood center. That five minutes the needle is in, there's just a slight tightness. No problem."

When he goes to donate, Malkie asks to see a list of people in need of blood. "I usually choose children to receive credit for the blood I donate, because they have more of their lives ahead of them. I've received wonderful letters of thanks from

children and adults."

Jack Calloway, the six-gallon man, says he was "really surprised" when informed he had donated that much blood. "That seems like a lot. I hadn't thought about it.

"I just give blood whenever they have a drive out here and other times when a relative or friend needs it," Calloway explains. "I've got good blood, and if someone needs it, I don't mind giving it. It doesn't hurt you; it builds back up. It's great that you can do that."

Calloway, a native of Henrietta, Texas, has been working at the Complex since 1968. His favorite outside activity is riding motorcycles, which, he points out, makes him doubly aware of the need to have blood available.
