

HOUSTON, TEXAS, July 11th, 1900,

Sealed proposals addressed to Arthur Lipper, City Secretary, City of Houston, Texas, will be received up to 12 O' clock, Noon on Monday July 23rd, 1900, for the construction of a timber trestle bridge over White Oak Bayou, at foot of Montgomery Avenue, connecting the First and Fifth Wards, as per plans and specifications on file in the City Engineer's office, City Hall.

All proposals must be accompanied by a certified check for \$250, on any bank in Houston, made payable to the Mayor of said city, without conditions, same to be forfeited as liquidated damages in case of failure of the successful bidder to enter into contract and bond as required by the City Council,

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a bond in the sum of One thousand dollars, with any responsible individuals or security Company as bondsmen,

The successful bidder will be required to complete the above mentioned work within sixty ( 60 ) days after the signing of his contract and approval thereof by the Mayor and Board of Public Works of said city and for failure to complete said work within said time limit, will forfeit the sum of ten dollars ( \$ 10. ) per day, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, for each and very day after the expiration of said time limit,

The contractor will be governed by all the ordinances of said city, regulating or pertaining to public works, especially the Labor Ordinance and must agree to proper deductions from contract price for violations thereof,

All proposals must be accompanied by a certified check for \$200, or any bank in Houston, made payable to the Mayor of said city, without conditions, same to be forfeited as liquidated damages in case of failure of the successful bidder to enter into contract and bond as required by the City Council.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a bond in the sum of One thousand dollars, with any responsible individuals or surety company as bondsmen.

The successful bidder will be required to complete the above mentioned work within sixty (60) days after the signing of his contract and approval thereof by the Mayor and Board of Public Works of said city and for failure to complete said work within said time limit, will forfeit the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) per day, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, for each and every day after the expiration of said time limit.

The contractor will be governed by all the ordinances of said city, relating or pertaining to public works, especially the labor ordinances and must agree to prefer deductions from contract price for violations thereof.

The undersigned, Arthur Lipper, City Engineer, is authorized to receive proposals, and to open and read the same in the presence of the Mayor and Board of Public Works of said city, at the City Hall, Houston, Texas, on July 11th, 1900, at 10 o'clock, A.M.
