Dear Sir:

This owns receipt of yours of November 23rd. I am pleased to know that the financial conditions are such that this can be taken care of under Mr. Stevenson's proposal.

As to your last paragraph; I saw a newspaper announcement that the appropriation for the City-County Hospital had been or would be granted through the PWA. If this is correct, it seems to me that the proposition put up to Judge Ward should be diplomatically pressed to determine the County's attitude, followed by like determination of the City's attitude, and in case one or both propose making such an arrangement (which I understand to mean a maximum of \$3.00 and reimbursement if an audit shows their cost less) it may be found desirable for your Advisory Committee to urge that an outside investigation of our hospital situation such as was suggested in my communication of September 12th be made; meantime, of course, interesting the newspapers to this end.

As you know, Commissioner C. D. Massey has strongly advocated that a hospital unit be provided for the Tri-Cities, a proposition that seems sound, and as I see it, should be endorsed. As you further know, he and some of the other County and City Commissioners indicated that they approved of my position as reflected in my letter of September 12th which was distributed to all of the Commissioners.
