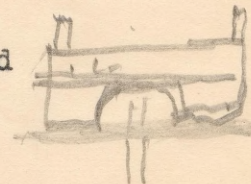

I have received the sketches without information as to whether they were sent by Dr. Slaughter or yourself. I am returning them herewith. Touching only on the above at this time, without assuming to know anything about the special requirements for such home, the following points occur to me that should have advance consideration:

- 1st - The location from the street which my idea is should be approximately the same distance as the main building.
- 2nd - I have had the idea that such building should either be in two units or an arch left over the walk if constructed in one building.
- 3rd - That particular attention should be given to the location and requirements for laundry.
- 4th - Like consideration for the heating and refrigerating plant having in mind that at some later time in the development of the property the latter will be centralized at some point between the hospital unit now constructed and the nurses' home.
- 5th - It seems to me that the second floor should be screened on the same lines as now apply to the hospital building.



I am mentioning these points for advance consideration expecting to discuss further with Dr. Slaughter and Mr. Sullivan when I return.
