Meantime, I think it is proper to say all here consider the work of planting trees that you are proposing to undertake, is to be highly commended. However, as a first step on property such as the Tubercular Hospital, the schools, etc., we think it might be well to follow our usual practice of developing a print such as the one enclosed, showing all buildings, driveways, walks present and prospective, and in addition thereto, the location, kind and size of present trees. Following such a course should greatly facilitate the landscape artist or engineer in recommending how and where additional trees and shrubbery should be placed.
