Committee Reports:

Social Education and Development - Linda Knapp- She stated that she needed more members on her committee.

Monetary and Fiscal - Jerry Monroe - He said that there were no funds and that we were operating in the red and therefore there will be no more convention bills considered right now.

George Harris then informed the House of the Student Finance Board. They are presently setting up the budget for next years funds. He passed out a ditto of the ~~ni~~ minutes and members of the board.

Bill Hensley, President of the Student Body then addressed the House. He talked about next years budget. He said that we will no longer get money from the vending machines, because they will be expanding so much. The vending machine money can run into thousands of dollars. We will get our money from the new student activities money. He also taled on the three bills which he has proposed, one on the Judiciary Branch, Tenure of Office and a Constitutional Amendment.
