

Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Houston:-

Section I. The salaries and fees of offices of the City of Houston whose terms will commence next after the ensuing City Election to be held on the first Monday in April A.D. 1894 shall be and the same are fixed as follows:-

The Mayor shall receive an annual salary of.....\$3000.00  
The City Secretary shall receive an annual salary of.....\$1800.00  
The City Treasurer shall receive an annual salary of.....\$1000.00  
The City Engineer shall receive an annual salary of.....\$2500.00  
The City Market Master shall receive an annual salary of...\$1500.00  
The City Street Commissioner shall receive an annual salary of \$1500.00  
The City Health Officer shall receive an annual salary of...\$1000.00  
The City Assessor and Collector of Taxes shall receive an annual salary of.....\$3000.00  
The City Marshall shall receive an annual salary of.....\$1000.00 and the City Marshall shall also be allowed the fees allowed him by ordinance.  
The City Attorney shall receive an annual salary of .....\$1000.00 and the City Attorney shall also be allowed a commission of ten per cent on all sums of money collected by him for the City where the said sums of money are collected by reason of the institution of suit in Court to force the collection of same, such percentage, however, only to be paid on the amounts actually collected, and only as the same are collected, and he shall also be entitled to the fees allowed him by ordinance.  
The City Recorder shall receive an annual salary of.....\$900.00  
Each Alderman shall receive five dollars for each meeting of the Council attended by him, whether regular, adjourned, called or special.  
The City Scavenger in lieu of an annual salary paid by the City shall be <sup>allowed to charge persons</sup> ~~allowed to charge persons~~ served by him at the rate as now provided by the ordinances of the City

Section 2. All annual salaries herein fixed shall be payable monthly and no officer shall be allowed to draw more than one twelfth of his annual salary each month.

 Each Alderman shall receive five dollars for each meeting of the Council  
 attended by him, whether regular, adjourned, or special.  
 The City Sergeant in lieu of an annual salary paid by the City shall be  
 allowed a salary of \$1000.00 per annum, to be paid by the City as now provided by  
 the ordinance of the City.

 no officer shall be allowed to draw more than one twelfth of his annual  
 salary each month.
