Book Review Corner

Gaudi Afternoon
Barbara Wilson
Seal Press, 1990

Barbara Wilson's latest is a real delight, a fast-moving comic mystery that is also a feminist novel, a good read that may also leave you with food for thought.

Gaudi Afternoon tells the story of one of the adventures of translator and world traveller Cassandra O'Reilly. Cassandra takes something of a break from her current project to help a young American woman who needs a translator to help her track down her husband in Barcelona. Things quickly get very complicated as O'Reilly's search leads her on a hilarious journey through the heart of gay and lesbian Barcelona.

Cassandra is a very attractive character in a number of ways. "My last lover called me 'deseccated,'" she tells us, "but that, I'm sure was just pique that I had called things off first On my better days I believe I resemble the middle-aged Katherine Hepburn." Cassandra's love life quickly becomes as complicated as the mystery itself. Her old friend Ana has suddenly decided that she wants to be a mother and that Cassandra should quit travelling and settle down for a life of domesticity. Another old flame, Carmen, is as much fun and as sexy as ever, but her religious scruples cause her to conduct much of her flirtation standing up (because horizontal means sin), which complicates matters. Cassandra also runs across the California earth mother Delilah, a foot masseuse she had met a few years earlier at a march, whose skilled hands take O'Reilly's mind completely off the investigation at a crucial moment.

In the midst of all this, Cassandra works off and on on her current translation project, a sweeping Latin American epic about a daughter's search for her mother by a writer whose style is a cross between Gabriel Garcia Marquez and Jackie Collins. She quotes from it occasionally, and so yet another fun part of reading Gaudi Afternoon is waiting to find out how this story within the story will come out.

The investigation and her work as translator come together one night while she is out drinking with both Ana and Carmen. They are searching the gay bars for a transsexual who may be dressed as either a man or as a woman and may or may not be wearing one of several wigs. The scene is quite funny ("I'll know her by her walk." "But Cassandra, all drag queens walk like that."), but it ends in a moment of seriousness as Cassandra's thinking about gender roles shifts. It's only a moment, though, and then back to the comic rollercoaster of the investigation at hand.

I can't say much about the actual mystery plot without giving too much away, but I would like to note that this is a murder-free mystery. No women as victims and no equal-opportunity women as killers. No real violence at all, in fact. Quite an accomplishment, and very much a feminist one. Gaudi Afternoon is both intensely kinetic and funny and feminist. I recommend it.

BREAST CANCER

**TREATMENT UPDATE:
ADJUVANT THERAPY
MAY BENEFIT PATIENTS
WITH EARLY STAGE DISEASE**

New information updates the treatment for breast cancer described in the accompanying booklet.


Recent studies have shown that women with early stage breast cancer may benefit from adjuvant (additional) therapy following primary treatment (mastectomy or lumpectomy with radiation therapy). These studies indicate that many breast cancer patients whose underarm lymph nodes show no sign of cancer (known as node negative) may benefit from chemotherapy or hormonal therapy after primary treatment. (These findings do not apply to women with preinvasive or *in situ* breast cancer.)

Until now, women whose underarm lymph nodes were free of cancer usually received no additional therapy because they have a relatively good chance of surviving the disease after primary treatment. But scientists know that cancer may return in about 30 percent of these women. Adjuvant therapy may prevent or delay the return of cancer.

Based on these findings, the National Cancer Institute has alerted doctors to consider using adjuvant therapy for their node negative breast cancer patients. Although there is strong evidence of the benefits of adjuvant therapy, there also are certain risks and expenses. Therefore, each woman should discuss her treatment options with her doctor.




