Dear Sir:

We have virtually all of the work completed at this location, with the exception of putting a small amount of woodwork around the top of the tank. This work cannot be done very conveniently until lights are available in the room, where the tank is installed. Of course it would be possible to find some way to do this work and not wait on the lights, but since the plant is not as yet needed, there is no need, as we see it, to finish up this small amount of work until it can be done under the proper condition.

Then too, the plant has not been charged, but we have purposely avoided doing this, knowing that the plant will not be needed or will not be used for some time yet. We did not want to charge the plant and have it standing there in that condition an indefinite period of time.

Aside from this small amount of work which is really being delayed on account of the fact that the building is not finished and the owner is not ready to use the plant.

If there were going to be some considerable delay along this line, we believe it would be only fair to either pay us final payment with plant in the present status or for us to proceed and finish up everything there is to be done by us which we could of course do quickly, and which would then put us in a position to claim final payment. What do you think would be the best procedure to follow?
