On August 12th. we furnished you statement showing a balance of ~~\$420.00~~^{\$428.80} due us on equipment we furnished for the Dominican Sisters' job, but as yet we have not received your voucher to cover. \$400.00 of this amount represents the final payment on this contract and, according to the terms of the contract, was due on July 7th.
