## BE NICE TO YOUR SAFETY GLASSES

Global Optical, the DPMC's safety glasses supplier, advises us that you cannot treat the plastic lenses in those glasses like glass ones.

Their advice is: "Wash lenses and frames, preferably in warm, soapy water. Rinse thoroughly, removing all soap film. Dry with soft, clean cloth or soft paper towel. Kleenex is fine to use, but leaves lint."

They also advise: "Don't wipe the lenses without rinsing off the lenses first because dust and dirt act as an abrasive and will scratch the lenses if not removed before wiping them. Don't use treated paper or treated cloth to wipe the lenses because its silicon base will scratch."
