Woodard Seeks Title

The Deer Park Chamber of Commerce has added the attraction of a queen contest to its annual Fall Festival, which will be held this year on October 25-27. One of four teenage contestants will reign over the event's three days of festivities.

One of those teenagers, Alane Woodard, 17, is the daughter of Jim B. Woodard, Distribution specialist, and the granddaughter of the late J. B. Woodard, Sr., who retired from Treating in 1961. Alane is a junior at Deer Park High School, a member of the Deer Escorts and the Student Congress, a varsity basketball cheerleader and a choir officer.

The contest's purpose is to raise money for the construction of a 5,000 square foot Chamber of Commerce building on West 13th Street near the ball park. The enclosed structure, expected to cost \$60,000 to \$80,000, will provide a site for future Fall Festivals and other local activities.

The Chamber divided Deer Park into four precincts and a contestant was selected to represent each precinct. The queen will be the contestant who collects the most votes at 25 cents each. By initiating this contest, the Chamber hopes to raise at least \$30,000 to \$40,000 for their new building. Along with the queen contest, they plan to conduct other fund-raising activities, such as the flea market planned for Saturday, October 13, at the Chamber of Com-


