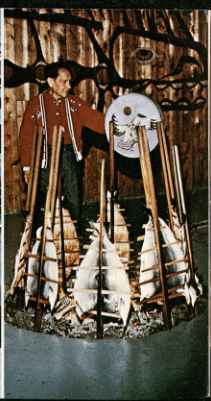
Seattle. The city where the mountains meet the sea.
