## Trial scheduled Monday for policeman accused of killing Paez

*Is the often postponed trial  
for Kevin McCoy finally at  
hand?*

The often-postponed trial date for Houston police officer Kevin McCoy, charged with negligent homicide in the death of gay activist Fred Paez, appeared near once again as attorneys announced that the trial was set to start at 12:30 p.m. Monday, Aug. 31, in the courtroom of Judge J.D. Guyon at 301 San Jacinto.

It was last scheduled for June 1 but postponed when McCoy's defense said it was tied up in another trial.

Prosecuting attorney Brian Raines said he expects the trial to last anywhere from a few days to a week.

Houston Gay Political Caucus president Lee Harrington received a subpoena to appear as a witness.

Paez was an administrative assistant for the GPC when he was shot June 27, 1980.

The October 15, 1980 indictment says McCoy, "while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, placed a cocked, loaded pistol against the head of (Paez) and as a result thereof said pistol discharged," killing Paez.

Paez death came just a few days ahead of Gay Pride Week 1980

and prompted the wearing of black armbands at that year's Gay Pride Parade and the political rally in Spotts Park.

The misdemeanor charge is punishable by a year in prison and a \$2000 fine. Prosecutor Raines said the case will be tried in felony court because McCoy was a public official.

A grand jury investigation resulted in the charges against the 25-year old officer.

McCoy was relieved of official duty with pay after being indicted.

Paez encountered McCoy at a warehouse where the officer was working an off-duty security job. McCoy, a four-year police veteran, said Paez made sexual advances toward him in an alley, and, in the alleged attempt to arrest him, the officer's gun discharged.

McCoy admitted drinking beer the night of the killing but denied being intoxicated.

The Fred Paez Task Force, a civic group that conducted its own investigation into the death of the activist, said they would hold a "community meeting" the day after the announcement of the verdict in the trial.

## Van Ooteghem wins latest round

NEW ORLEANS—Montrose gay activist Gary Van Ooteghem had his free speech rights violated by former Harris County treasurer Hartsell Gray in 1975, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled Aug. 24.

It was the second time the court ruled in favor of Van Ooteghem, who was an assistant to Gray but who was fired when he threatened to address the Harris County Commissioners Court of behalf of gay rights.

The latest ruling was by the full court of 24 judges. The earlier ruling was by a segment of the judges. The Supreme Court had ordered the 5th Circuit Court to review the case again, *en banc*, or by the full court.

## Quaalude crisis

The Drug Enforcement Administration says that a drug known on the streets as "Ludes," has become a public health menace rivaling heroin in scope, especially in Texas.

DEA officials say that surveys of hospitals and morgues indicate that the drug Methaqualone—popularized under the trade name "Quaaludes"—is causing more injuries and trauma than heroin or any other illegal or controlled substance.

Methaqualone is a legitimate drug often prescribed by doctors as a sleeping pill. According to the DEA, however, companies in North America and Europe are turning out tons of unauthorized pills that are being diverted to the underground drug market for sale.

The American Medical Association reported last week that adolescents on Methaqualone are arriving at emer-

gency rooms and morgues in record numbers, where in Florida and Texas millions of "Ludes" are said to be coming in from drug-making labs in Europe.

In 1978, the DEA seized 1400 pounds of illicit Methaqualone; last year that figure had increased by almost 2000 percent to 27,000 pounds; and in the first five months of this year, the DEA had seized 71,000 pounds of the illegal sleeping pills.

## The secret of doodles

Do you sometimes find yourself doodling away on a piece of paper and suddenly find a series of circles, boxes or arrows in front of you?

Well, Texas handwriting expert Jay Larsen says those assorted, subconscious scribbles may be keys to your personality.

For example, Larsen says that women tend to draw more flowers, circular patterns and things to do with nature, while men draw more arrows, diamonds and linear or angular patterns. If a man draws circles, Larsen claims, he's searching for something.

According to Larsen, if someone draws squares and fills them in, that person has an organized and analytical thinking process. Concentric circles, on the other hand, especially those that get larger and larger, exhibit a desire to break away from something.

Larsen adds that arrows are only important when their direction is observed. For example, he says, if the arrows point to the right, a person is concerned with the future, while an arrow pointing to the left shows a concern with the past.

Larsen says that trees symbolize goals, and drawing profiles means a person is afraid to face things square on.

The Venture-N's business is gearing back up. Each week's a little better than the last—and with the right crowd.


Steve Wallace, former owner of Houston's first gay disco with a light show (Wonder's), reports he is alive and well—and frequently playing pool at Mary's.

## Gay Atheists hold convention

SAN FRANCISCO—The first national Gay Atheists League of America (GALA) convention was held August 14-16 with about 75 participants.

Ironically, the convention met in what used to be a Roman Catholic nunnery until vacated and then made into the Pride Foundation's Gay Community Center.

At the opening night ceremonies, San Francisco Supervisor (city council position) Harry Britt presented a welcome and an award from the Board of Supervisors to Tom Rolfsen, founder of GALA.

Rolfsen, who is close to 70 years of age, accepted the award and gave a speech in an emotionally charged atmosphere.

Rolfsen said in his speech that Madlyn Murray O'Hare, the Austin atheist, has turned around completely in her attitude toward gay people and now accepts gay atheists in her American Atheists organization and even allows Rolfsen to reprint its articles.

Harry Britt in his remarks said that the churches have traditionally failed both women and gay people. He said they have tried to impose narrow categories of acceptable behavior on other people based on their own experiences instead of on the needs and experiences of the people involved.

Later in the evening, the Sisters of

Perpetual Indulgence gave a "religious" service to the assembled members.

## Hairy is scary

SALT LAKE CITY—This may be bad news for Montrose men with beards who may be engaged in social work dealing with children. Children are afraid of beards.

Two psychologists at Brigham Young University say that a study of 132 boys and 121 girls has found that most young kids are scared by beards.

The three-to-seven-year-olds reportedly were shown four different renderings of the same man: one clean-shaven, two with mustaches, and one with a full beard. The kids were then asked to pick out the "nice man" and the "scary man."

Psychologists Parley Newman and Darwin Gale, writing in *Psychology Today* magazine, say that the man with the beard was almost always selected as "the scary man" by both boys and girls. The clean-shaven man was given the friendliest ratings.

The two researchers suggest that bearded professionals, whose jobs require establishing rapport with children, may be creating problems for themselves by sporting "scary faces."

## 'Heart Throbs' can kill you

Sex can literally kill you—if you're suffering from heart problems.

That's the warning of British government pathologist Alan Usher.

Usher says sex can be a dangerous pastime for middle aged people with heart troubles, especially men.

Usher says that autopsies on many men who are reported to have died peacefully in their sleep reveal symptoms of heart disease. He adds that many of these so-called peaceful deaths may actually have been sudden deaths during sex which are not reported as such.

Usher describes the case of a company director found slumped over the back seat of his car killed by a heart attack. Says the pathologist, "His positioning and kneeling was very typical and indicative of (sexual activity)." It later became known, he says, that the man had been having sex in the car with an employee.

## Kids need 'dirty' words

When kids get together to talk about sex, they need to use so-called "dirty words."

At least that's the opinion of Sandra Cole, as instructor in the psychiatry department at the University of Michigan.

Cole told a conference on human sexuality recently that words kids pick up in health care and science classes don't really do the trick when they want to talk to each other about sex.

Cole insisted that a so-called dirty vocabulary is an essential survival skill for children, and that, "You can't

protect a child (from dirty words) unless you keep them at home wrapped in cotton and kept in his room." ZNS

## Pot or hash?

Most jurisdictions across the United States impose much stiffer penalties for possessing hashish than they do for possessing marijuana.

But that all may change now, because a judge in Minnesota has ruled that it is virtually impossible to establish a scientific difference between hashish and pot.

Hashish is usually defined as being a more potent derivative of marijuana. However a Minneapolis millionaire, Percy Ross, was recently busted on charges of possessing 3.5 grams of "hashish," a felony in Minnesota.

Ross decided to challenge this definition.

Several expert witnesses testified in court that there is no clear chemical distinction between hash and pot. The experts told Hennepin County District Judge Crane Winton that both substances contain leafy or vegetable material, that both contains resins, and that it's just the proportions of these substances in hash and pot that are different.

Judge Winton acquitted Ross, ruling that Ross may have been holding a small quantity of Marijuana—not hash. Pot possession in Minnesota is a minor offense.

Dozens of county prosecutors are reported to be asking for copies of Judge Winton's ruling.

## Dragnet revival

CHICAGO—Newspaper television columnist Gary Deeb reports that the new politics of the Reagan administration has swept *Dragnet* star Jack Webb back into vogue.

Deeb, who writes for the *Chicago Sun-Times*, reports that CBS has hired right-wing producer, director and actor Webb to develop a weekly dramatic series about the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. The proposed series, earmarked for a 1982 premiere, is titled *The Corps*.

The tight-lipped, clench-jawed Webb

gained fame in the early 50s when he created *Dragnet*, a series about the inner workings of a police detective squad. The episodes usually ended with a recounting of how many years in prison suspects eventually received.

Deeb says that two additional "right wing" dramas, neither involving Webb, are set to premiere this fall on ABC. They are *Strike Force*, starring Robert Stack as the head of an undercover police squad, and *Today's FBI*, with Mike Connors as what Deeb calls a "red, white and blue" FBI man. ZNS

## Sex and drugs

WASHINGTON—The Food and Drug

Administration is warning there are more than 30 drugs on the market today that may take the joy out of sex.

Judith Willis, the editor of the FDA's *Drug Bulletin*, says that dozens of compounds that are prescribed for such things as high blood pressure, weight control or high cholesterol levels have been found to produce sexual impotency as a side effect.

Many other commonly prescribed drugs, Willis says, may also dampen or even deaden the sex drive altogether.

Among the better-known compounds alleged to have "sexual side effects" are such drugs as valium, librium, haldol and amphetamines.

Willis does say that, while the vast majority of the drugs seem to be sexual

downers, a few of the substances have been found actually to increase the desire for sex. ZNS



# Iranian government admits execution of homosexuals, denies executing children, but says it could

The Iranian government announced in mid-August the execution of 54 more people, most charged with armed insurrection or drug smuggling, but one charged with being a homosexual.

The alleged homosexual was reportedly stoned to death by a crowd. Most of the others were led before firing squads, news reports said.

Dozens of homosexuals have been executed by the government of Ayatollah Khomeini since his rise to power.

Meanwhile, the Iranian Judge Ayatollah Mohammadi Gilani, who signed the death warrants for those found guilty of government opposition, has denied that children aged 13 and 14 were among those executed.

Gilani told a press conference, "None was less than 17."

The judge is reported to have added, however, that on the basis of Islam, "A nine-year old girl is considered mature, so there is no difference for us between a nine-year-old girl and a 40-year-old man, and it does not prohibit us from issuing any kinds of sentences." ZNS
