

Feb., 6, 1963

House of Representatives Executive Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Speaker Pro Tem, George Harris.

Monetary and Fiscal Committee - Jerry Monroe reported that unless an organization was one of the three which had stated letters of intent for conventions, there would be no use in presenting convention bills. President Bill Hensley, then told him that there would be no more money available for conventions and there would be no need to worry about convention bills. Jerry reported at the Budget Board meeting, Feb. 4, 1963, they discussed the transition that would take place from going from a private to a state school. We would no longer receive money from the vending machines. There will be a \$30.00 activity fee next year which will have to be used by student government, athletics and etc.

President of the Student Body, Bill Hensley, then told the Executive Council about the three proposals that he will be presenting in the meeting, Monday, Feb. 11, 1963. He asked us to look it over before the House Meeting. They are on the following topics: Judicial Code, Tenure of Office and a Constitutional Amendment on the House of Representatives.

Process and Procedure - Allan Segal reported that we need more cooperation between the House, Senate and the Student Body Officers. He said that they are working on it right now. He also reported that his committee is working on the House of Representatives By - Laws on the requirements of the Speaker Pro Tem. They would like to change the requirements to be that same as those required for the Speaker, in the advent of the removal or resignation of the Speaker.

It was then brought up that we need to hold a special election of a new Speaker, due to the drop out of the Speaker, Charles La Monte. When going through the rules for speaker, it was realized that a constitutional amendment was needed and the Process and Procedure chairman started working on this. That dates of the election are Feb. 20 and 21 and the run offs will be scheduled for Feb. 27 and 28, 1963. The filing deadline will be Feb. 15, 1963 at noon.

Social Education and Development - Linda Knapp - reported that she had scheduled a meeting of her committee, Monday at noon.

We then all went over the election rules for the special elections and changed the times the polls would be opened.
