Further referring to my memorandum of October
31st on the above:

The cost of the trees, procured at the nurseries
by me and planted by our men, is as follows:

BUSHWAY AND JAPANESE NURSERY

Trees to caliper	1" to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ "	each	\$2.00	Total cost	\$104.00
"	"	"	1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 2"	"	208.00
"	"	"	2" to 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ "	"	247.00

I have inspected these trees and find that the
Japanese Nursery has what I consider the best specimen and
their prices are lower than the others on the size tree that
I would recommend planting, i.e., the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 2" caliper, as
the smaller size is too small for street trees and the
larger size is hardly worth the difference in price.

Teas Nursery charges the same price, either for
his planting the trees or our planting the trees.
