Travis, William Barret, 1809-1836

took over command of the Alamo February 14, 1836, and died March 6, 1836.

Burman (or Burnham), Jesse, 1792-1883.

one of Stephen F. Austin's Old Three Hundred colonists, who established a trading post known as Burnam's Crossing near La Grange.

Lacy, William Demetris, 1808-1848.

came to Texas in 1831 and established a tanyard and saddle shop near the present site of Columbus; later served under Col. James Morgan and George Sutherland.
