My Dear Mrs. Booth:

Remembering our pleasant talk at Ennis, and your cordial invitation to come down to Gonzales for some Suffrage work, I am writing to tell you of a meeting which I have called for San Antonio, June 5th, at Gunter Hotel, ten o'clock in the morning, in Ball Room, in regard to better moral conditions surrounding the concentration camps in Texas. I am particularly anxious that you should be present. This is certainly a question upon which all women get together; and I hope you will use your influence to have others present.

At the close of this meeting I expect to go to Floresville to speak on the evening of Thursday the seventh. And then Miss Engle, (who is our Field Secretary, and a very fine young lady, who endears herself to all,) and I will come over to Gonzales. Will you be so good as to get up a meeting (for the women) in the afternoon of Friday, June 8th, at any hour you deem best, either at the hotel where we will be staying, or at any of the churches which will open their doors, or any of the private homes, - just as you think best. Of course at the first meeting, women would be more likely to come to a private home in response to a personal invitation than if it is a general one.
