



STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION SENATE JOURNAL

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The twelfth meeting of the eleventh session of the Student Senate of the University of Houston Students' Association was called to order at 7:10 P.M. in the San Jacinto Room of the University Center by Speaker Pro Tempore ELLEDGE. The minutes were approved as written.

The following Senators were absent: COLE, GREENE, KEITH.

President's Report

Vice President TEIXEIRA reported on the status of Kelsaw. Vice President said that Dr. Feilds had been recommended to Dr. Hoffman to give Kelsaw tenure. He added that it will go to the Board of Regents, Monday.

Vice President TEIXEIRA said that McDougale had been appointed to the HPE Dept. Chair.

Vice President TEIXEIRA said that at the Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young Concert, there could be no cans, or bottles. However, thermos jugs and bed rolls were permitted.

The Student Defender, PETE WILLIAMSON said won a case at the Texas Supreme Court. He said that if a student is enrolled at the University of Houston under class of non resident through wrong classification, McCassey was liable for tuition paid over the years. He suggested that any student under non resident appeal classification.

Student Defender, WILLIAMSON said that Attorney General made another motion to dismiss law suits against University of Houston's Traffic and Security searching individuals in Hoffeinz and Jeppesen Stadium. He added that any known persons that have been searched, to get in contact, so that an attempt be made to get court to issue an injunction prior to the next concert. WILLIAMSON said that T & S cannot search if it is not in plain view. However, they can confiscate if it is in plain view.

Senator WIESGAL suggested a meeting between the SA Office and the University to set up a search procedure for future concerts.

Senator MARTIN said that they were in the process of doing that.

Committee Report

Treasurer MIKE MARTIN said that the Coordinating Board was to meet Tuesday to establish new residency rules. He added that the Vice President journeyed to Austin to establish new residency rules; however, no fundamental changes were made to favor students. There were only minor wording changes.

Committee Report

Senator GOLDBERG of Games Committee said that bowling prices had been raised 10¢ to cover AMF hike. He added that, because of the complaints from students of non-student ping-pong players, a 75¢ fee was added to non-students. Senator GOLDBERG said that there is a 50¢ per day charge for a guest card for individuals residing in the Campus Hotel.

Committee Report

Senator ROCHE, Chair of Food Services Committee, said that Interstate United Food Services had best proposal of the four food services interviewed, including SAGA Food Services. He added that there was no set proposal on liquor.

Senator ROCHE said that a committee was flying to S. Illinois to investigate the food service there.

Senator RESTE asked whether the food service was in support of the lettuce boycott.

Senator ROCHE said that he had asked the other three bidders, but not Interstate United.

Speaker Pro Tempore ELLEDGE asked if the letter had been sent to SAGA.

Senator ROCHE said yes.

President's report turned over to President Fine

President FINE said that the University was undergoing a self-study program, TASK FORCE, acquired to maintain accreditation. He said that there were nine Task Forces aimed at different broad areas throughout the University. He added that there was a great need for volunteer; he urged the Senators to commit themselves and their friends to some of the committees. He requested that the senators turn in names and a little background interest, because at least fifty persons were needed to fill these positions.

Senator JESSE asked where the names should be submitted.

President FINE said that they should be submitted straight to the SA Office.

Appointment of Bob Chains to Alt. Traffic Court

Senator HERRINGTON, Vice Chair of Rules, moved for the approval of Bob Chains for the position of Alternate Traffic Court Justice.

The floor was opened to question.

Senator GUERRIN asked whether the fact that faculty didn't have to pay fines was reasonable.

CHAINS said no. He added that pressure should be put on Traffic and Security to have faculty pay fines.

Senator HERRINGTON moved for acclamation, but there was an objection.

Senator GUERRIN called the question.

Chain was approved 10 - 0.

Appointment of Jack Moore to Business Senator

Senator HERRINGTON, Vice Chair of Rules, moved for the approval of Jack Moore to the position of Business Senator.

The floor was opened to questions.

Moore said that he was willing to do the jobs appointed to him.

Senator ROCHE said that Jack had tried at the elections, but he had lost.

Senator GUERRIN said that Jack had been working with orientation and had done a pretty good job.

Jack Moore was approved 9 - 0

Jack Moore was sworn in by President FINE.

Senate Bill 20019

Senator HERRINGTON, Vice Chair of Rules, moved for the approval of Senate Bill 20019, A SENATE BILL TO AMEND THE ELECTION CODE.

Senator HERRINGTON added two changes:

Sect. 2 - from 112.12 to 112.02

Sect. 5 - from for Board of Regents to or Board of Regents

Senator FRIEND asked why voting machine sample ballots were not printed until two days before the election. She added that if printers made a mistake, that SA Office could not be responsible.

Senator EURESTE said that the printing should be done for free when the printers print something wrong.

Senator HERRINGTON said that the problem could be alleviated if the ballots were just print and run off on campus.

Senator HERRINGTON moved for acclamation.

It was approved 13 - 0.

Appointment of Jack Moore to Confidential
Records and Interpretations and Exceptions Committee

Senator HANSEL, Chair of Student Life, moved for the approval of Jack Moore to the Committee of Confidential Records and Interpretations and Exceptions.

Senator HERRINGTON moved for acclamation, which was passed.

Senator HANSEL, Chair of Student Life moved for the approval of Juan Lira to the Committee of Confidential Records on Interpretations and Exceptions.

Senator HERRINGTON moved for acclamation, which was passed.

Senator HANSEL said that within two weeks, discount ticket coupon booklets were going into effect.

Senate Resolution 20000 :

Senator COLLIER moved for the approval of Senate Resolution 20000, A SENATE RESOLUTION URGING TAX DEDUCTION OF EDUCATIONAL FEES.

Senator FRIEND moved for acclamation, which was approved.

Introduction of Legislation

Senator HERRINGTON introduced Senate Bill 20020, A SENATE BILL TO PARTIALLY FUND THE UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON CHEERLEADERS. It was sent to Rules.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 8.10.
