An Arkansas Physician Beats Fence-Straddler For Congress

We haven't been so thrilled in years as we were when the Little Rock School Board member won the Congressional race in the Fifth Arkansas district over Brooks Hays who has held that position since 1942.

Dr. Dale Alford is a Little Rock physician specializing in diseases of the eye, ear, nose and throat and up until a few weeks ago entering into a political contest was apparently the last thought he had in mind.

However, as a member of the Little Rock School Board he had been helpless as other members of the Board had sought to integrate the schools in direct opposition to the wishes of the people of that city and he obviously decided to try for a position where he could wield influence in segregation matters and render wider service to the cause.

Hays has been a pussyfooting fence-straddler on segregation, playing both ends against the middle under the repulsive cloak of "moderation" which means, in the final analysis, merely a cowardly way of passing the buck and letting others of more character and courage face up to the issue and dispose of it.

Hays beat an opponent in the regular primary but met his Waterloo when Dr. Alford decided during the last week of the campaign to enter the contest as a write-in candidate. He won by a large majority.

This method of getting elected is doing it the hard way but it just shows what can be done when conscientious and patriotic citizens decide they have had enough and make up their minds to do something about it.

If several hundred members of Congress got the same treatment from their constituents it would give them a wholesome respect for the electorate and provide them with a forceful reminder that they are merely the servants of the people sent to Washington to do their bidding.

A JACKASS CAN BRAY LOUDER THAN A LION CAN ROAR

Paul Butler is a little pipsqueak politician from Indiana who currently heads the National Committee of the Socialist-Democratic Party.

Emboldened by the disgraceful action of Congress in passing the Civil Rights bill and by the infamous decision of the Supreme Court on integration of the schools, he publicly hurled impudent and insulting remarks at Southern Democrats recently and virtually ordered them out of the party.

In a television program originating in Washington, he warned that there would be "no compromise" on the Civil Rights issue in 1960 and added that if Southerners don't like it they can leave the party.

This two-bit ward heeler from Indiana proved all over again that a jackass can bray louder than a lion can roar but disregarded an established fact of history which shows that in a contest involving the relative strength of the two, the jackass always winds up as a mangled carcass rotting in the sun.

It is true that Conservative Democrats are in the minority just now in the councils of the Democratic Party but they have right on their side and there is a ground swell of resentment throughout the country against subversives in both parties. It is not inconceivable that sound Americans may wrest the party of Jefferson from its enemies and make it the symbol of Americanism it once was.

In this event, trashy imposters such as Butler would be thrown out and converted into insignificant has-beens which nature designed them to be in the first place.

In the meantime, we would remind the cheap little political hack from Indiana that there is no Democratic Party for Southerners to leave. It long ago left them when it cast aside every principle in which true Democrats believe. It is now nothing more than a conglomeration of Socialists, labor racketeers and lame-brain intellectuals who have no more respect for the Constitution or understanding of the fundamentals of the American governing system than a retarded Chinese Coolie has for the law of gravity.

The individual States of the American Union were originally endowed with authority that was paramount to that of the Federal Government which they had created and vested with limited power. But the Chief Executives of the States for the past twenty-five years have, by and large, been constituted of such weak and shabby material that they have allowed their basic official status to degenerate to that of political enuchs. Not only have they not exercised their Sovereign Rights but most of them didn't even know they had any. Like paupers with tin cups in their hands, they have meekly trudged to Washington to humbly beg "aid" from a Federal Bureaucracy which has no money of its own and can only give that which it first takes by force from the citizens of the several States after knocking them unconscious with the powerful weapon of an extortionate tax law. If Constitutional Government is to be restored in the United States, the heads of each of the Commonwealths must be educated in primary law of the Republic. They must learn something which they should have known before offering for high public office and that is that the Governors of our Sovereign States hold eminent domain in the American governing system and are not penniless beggars grudgingly permitted to exist through the generosity of Washington Bureaucrats who charitably grant them Squatters Rights on the Federal Reservation.

Unless and until each and every Chief Executive of a Sovereign State in this country familiarizes himself with the basic law of the Republic and recognizes and reclaims his organic power, they are going to continue to shudder, shake and shiver as Federal tyranny increasingly rears its ugly head.

If the whole pattern of our governing structure appears too complicated for them to assimilate, they have only to study and memorize the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution which will enable them to grasp the fact that the Federal Government can legally exercise only such authority as has been granted under this provision of that matchless document: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people".

No grant of power, or assignment of authority conferred on a segment of human society since the beginning of time was ever set forth in more direct and unmistakable terms, or more sharply defined, than this delegation of responsibility to the several States by those who founded the American Republic.

Under this bestowal of supreme sovereignty on the States by the founding fathers, it should be clear to the most ignorant and unlearned among us that the Supreme Court, as a body, has no more right to rob the State of its authority than individual members of that Court have to sneak into the home of a citizen at midnight and steal his silver.

It was the relinquishment of this sacred obligation by the nation's Governors which has caused Federal agencies to seize and usurp power not delegated to them by the Constitution and to set up a Dictatorship over the lives, freedom and property of the American people.

Massed assault on State Sovereignty was begun under the New Deal when a horde of big blow-hards breezed into high Federal posts in Washington on a blast of hot air generated by leftwingers, one-worlders and Communist sympathizers and who made their first order of business the repeal of the Tenth Amendment without benefit of Constitutional procedure. Soviet influence then, as now, largely shaped policies of government and Communist leaders had repeatedly impressed on their

Something Is Very Rotten In The Great State of Oklahoma

The Constitution of the United States has taken an awful beating in recent years but never perhaps has that document been so flagrantly violated as by a Federal Court in Okmulgee, Oklahoma.

Recently four Negro pupils, urged on by the hate-mongering NAACP, demanded to be enrolled in an all-white school in Okmulgee, and the Federal judge there jumped through the hoop like a performing chimpanzee, and ordered the school to admit the Negroes at once.

Of course this sorry performance on the part of Federal judges has become routine in many parts of the country but the case of Oklahoma is exceptional.

That State was admitted to the Union in 1907 and part of the enabling act by which it became a State said: "That provision shall be made for the establishment and maintenance of a system of public schools . . . provided . . . that this shall not be construed to prevent the establishment and maintenance of separate schools for white and colored children."

Another provision in the enabling act says that the public schools of that State "shall forever remain under the exclusive control of the State or its governmental sub-division".

Thus, in addition to the authority given the States under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution, the State of Oklahoma had double protection in the form of the enabling act through which it became a member of the Union and which actually prohibited the mixing of the races in the schools.

There is only one conclusion to be reached in the case of the Oklahoma situation and that is that there must be very weak, submissive and incompetent leadership there or they would have fought to the last ditch before they knuckled under to this raid by a Federal judge on their rights so definitely defined by those who founded that great State.

DEFEAT OF MALONE BLOW TO GOOD GOVERNMENT

One of the greatest losses suffered by the forces of good government in the recent election was the defeat of the Honorable George Malone of Nevada who was beaten by a Fair Deal nonentity in his race for re-election as Senator from that State.

Because of his record of useful service in Washington, Malone was one of those singled out by labor racketeer Reuther for extinction and union money was said to have been diverted to that State in amounts out of all proportion to the State's size and magnitude.

followers in this country that a nation made up of forty-eight composite units was practically impregnable while one with all power vested in a central government was vastly easier to overthrow.

Striking down the Sovereignty of the various States in preparation for readying us for membership in a Soviet-dominated one-world government which was even then in the making, was the objective of International Communism at that time and it is today the aim of the same international conspirators against the United States. The unfinished program of the New Deal for the erasure of State lines has been taken up where they left off by the present Supreme Court. Like the mythical Frankenstein who set up a monster that ultimately destroyed him, the States who created the Federal Government now face extinction by a hydra-headed monster of their own making.

The elementary lesson which so many Americans, including Governors of the States, apparently never learned is that the States set up the Federal Government almost as an after-thought and purposely limited its authority in the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution in order to insure that there would be no strong and centralized agency comparable to the Throne of England from which country we had so recently, and at such tragic loss, wrung our freedom.

Since the States created the Federal Government, instead of the other way round, it follows in natural logic that the authority and power of the States, as the creator, supersede that of the Federal Government, as their creature.

To provide a double check and endow the States with the power to exercise the supreme authority granted them in the Tenth Amendment, the framers of the Constitution devised a method of amending this document in which the States could proceed independently of Congress and act directly in forcing through a Constitutional amendment of their own.

In Article V it is provided that when two-thirds, or thirty-three, of the Legislatures of the several States propose an amendment to the Constitution, it becomes incumbent on Congress to submit this proposed amendment to the various State Legislatures for ratification and when three-fourths, or thirty-seven, Legislative bodies have acted favorably, the amendment becomes a part of the Constitution.

Thus, according to a strict interpretation of that document, it is not unreasonable to contend that thirty-three States of the American Union could propose an amendment abolishing the Supreme Court and when, and if, such amendment were ratified by thirty-seven States, it would be in force and effect and the nine members of that horribly perverted Tribunal would be forced back into the field where they acquired their judicial experience and compelled to again start chasing ambulances, trying uncontested divorce cases and defending Negro craps-shooters.

The vast political power which the States were commissioned to exert has become dormant from disuse just as a member of the human body degenerates into a vestigial organ from lack of exercise and it will require almost superhuman strength of character, firmness and determination on the part of the Governors of the several States to recapture their surrendered authority and make it function again in the interest of Constitutional Government.

They can't undo all the acts of treason committed against the safety and security of the American Republic during the past twenty-five years by those in high posts of authority; they can't recover the billions of dollars which have been shamefully extorted from the nation's taxpayers and given to alien enemies for building war machines intended to eventually destroy us and they can't retract the millions of weasel words of appeasement of Communists which have been babbled by our diplomats and which have made a mockery of our pretended opposition to the Soviet menace.

But by effective, coordinated and intelligent action on the part of the heads of thirty-seven of the Sovereign States in the use of the amending provision placed in the Constitution for their benefit by men with foresight, vision and wisdom far exceeding their own, they could reassert their Constitutional rights and thereby clear away much of the black mass of corruption, subversion and treason which now hangs over the nation's capital like a blanket of fog.

A virile, vigorous and lusty organization of Chief Executives of a majority of the Sovereign States, under robust leadership and set up for the sole purpose of keeping a careful watch on our public servants in Washington and immediately resisting any aggression against the basic Rights of the States at its inception, could become the most potent and dominant political force for the restraint and curbing of greedy, unprincipled and power-mad politicians ever devised for the protection of a tyranny-ridden people in the history of the world.

There is, of course, some sort of makeshift Governors Conference now wherein the Chief Executives of all States get together once a year and yak yak about who is going to be elected to what office but as a medium of forceful, dynamic and effective political action, they wield about as much influence as old women who gossip over the backyard fence while hanging out the family wash.

If the Governors of the Sovereign States are going to persist in sidestepping their Constitutional responsibility and continue to function merely as impotent attendants in the Federal harem, it has been suggested that we abolish all State Governments entirely, save the billions of dollars required to finance them and let Washington take us over and line us up like sitting ducks as we wait for International Communists to either shoot us down or conscript us as slaves in a Soviet One-World State.

Every organization opposed to the American form of government such as the National Education Association, National Council of Churches, Americans for Democratic Action, Committee for an Effective Congress and other Marxist groups have their representatives right on the job in Washington the year round. But the Governors of the States who have been paged by destiny for a stellar role in the nation's governing system don't know what's going on there until after it happens and they have been stripped of the last vestige of their Constitutional Rights.

At least once in the life of every great nation there comes a clarion call for men of conviction, of principle and of action to save that nation from despoilers within its own borders and to repel those who would betray it.

That call has now gone out to the Governors of the Sovereign States and the burning question which troubles the heavy hearts of all true Americans is whether or not they will face and accept the challenge.

South Not About To Surrender To Integration, Senator Insists

In Augusta on November 7 a vast assemblage from Georgia and South Carolina heard an address by a member of the United States Senate who talked like an American, like a Southerner and like a man.

The speaker was the Honorable Strom Thurmond of South Carolina and there was no note of compromise, of surrender, appeasement or retreat in the fight on the Supreme Court which seeks to integrate the public school systems of the South.

"The South will launch the most massive campaign of all-out, non-violent resistance ever witnessed on this continent if the Federal government continues to press for integrated schools," Senator Thurmond declared. "We are not about to surrender now or in the future. Instead, we hereby declare total and unremitting war on the Supreme Court's unconstitutional usurpations and unlawful arrogation of power.

"As the first step, let us make it grimly clear to the Court that we reject both its unacceptable alternatives — that we will make an adequate system of mass education for all our people, either a public system or a private system".

Thurmond admitted that he was fully aware that the course he advocated will inevitably come into direct conflict with the orders of the Federal courts but added: "So be it," as the audience of several thousand cheered wildly.

In introducing Senator Thurmond, Georgia's Governor Marvin Griffin told the assemblage that "contrary to whatever the long-haired liberals, the wild-eyed dogooders, the radicals and the scoundrels might say — the Supreme Court of the United States does not make the law of the land."

Such propaganda, he insisted, is an insult to the integrity and intelligence of all American citizens.

HAPPY DAYS ARE HERE AGAIN!

It has not yet been announced whether or not Eleanor Roosevelt's friend, Myris Chaney, will be plucked out of oblivion and commissioned to teach ballet dancing to relief clients on the government payroll.

Justice Department Promises Investigation of "Hate Groups"

Bombings Are Part of the Overall Communist Plot

The dropping of bombs which destroy property and endanger human life is a horrible criminal act and is second only to the destruction being wrought by the Supreme Court in wrecking the Constitution and abolishing the established government of an entire nation.

A bulletin of the National Review, dated October 18, said: "The U.S. Communist underground has been ordered to carry out acts of violence, sabotage and arson in the South, with the expectation that they will be automatically blamed on 'racial extremists'".

Under these conditions, it is going to be extremely difficult to stop these outrages because, in the unlikely event that officers of the law are able to pin the blame on the Communists where it belongs, the Supreme Court — if past performance is indicative of future action — will turn them loose.

AMERICANS HAVE NOTHING TO LOSE IN FORMING NEW PARTY

We have always maintained, and still do, that no Third Party in this country can be successful and especially when such party is formed by private citizens in scattered areas of the country with no political know-how and having no political influence.

With the two major parties having a firm grip on the present political machinery, only powerful political elements with an appreciable number of electoral votes can hope to present formidable opposition to the two Socialist Parties now operating under Democratic and Republican labels.

Such chairmanships are going to be only a hollow mockery anyway in the future since Northern liberals are now as thick in Congress as fleas on a sharecropper's hound and will out-vote Southerners at every turn.

It will also mean that Southern Governors will have to assume the leadership which the Constitution provided that they should exert and show some concern for the restoration of the Rights of States.

If twelve or fifteen States, including those of the South, will go to the Democratic National Convention with a delegation solidly pledged to the restoration of Constitutional Government in the United States and refuse to let the liberal forces out-think and out-trade them, they can hold the balance of power in the 1960 election.

By that time the people will be as disgusted with the Fair Dealers as they are now with Modern Republicans and may have developed the intestinal fortitude to go to the polls and vote their wrath and contempt.

Meantime a coalition of sound Republicans with Southern Conservative Democrats in Congress, such as that which staved off total Communism during Roosevelt's and Truman's administrations should operate to prevent a complete wreck of the economy and social customs of the country during the next two years.

The only catch to that is that it will take a finetooth comb to find any sound Republicans in the next Congress but maybe the Modern Republicans have learned a lesson from the stinging defeat administered to their forces on November 4 and will fall in line and work with Southern Democrats in a final attempt to keep from being liquidated completely.

Thinking Americans have been insisting for a long time that the national situation would have to get worse before it gets any better but no sane person can now deny that in the matter of national representation and leadership we are at the bottom of the heap.

What could we lose by the formation of a Third Party that we haven't already lost anyway?

Demand For Washington School Report Increases

The District of Columbia Committee of the House of Representatives has announced that it has had to order an extra printing of its 1956 school integration report because of a heavy demand for it in recent weeks.

A committee spokesman said that the requests for the report came from all over the nation.

Conditions in Washington schools, now made up of about 74 per cent Negroes and 26 per cent white, are shown in the report to be almost unbelievable with knifings and sex offenses composing the major part of the crimes which almost daily take place in the public schools there.

Meantime, the quiet exodus of white people from the capital into nearby segregated States continues without let-up.

It has been more than five years now since the Trumbull integrated housing project was set up in Chicago and racial violence has been almost constant since then. A full detail of police is kept stationed around the project day and night. That's in Chicago too and not the South.

NEW YORKERS TELL WHAT THEY DON'T LIKE ABOUT THE SOUTH

Two New York Lawmakers, from a State where criminal acts as a result of integration of the schools constitute nothing less than a nightmare, made a two-day trip to the South and decided what was wrong with Dixie and what the people there should have.

What is needed, said Jake Javitts and Kenneth Keating, is a Federal law to make the South behave.

They indicated that when Congress re-convenes they will introduce such a law.

It was as simple as that. From a Pullman window they diagnosed the situation and suggested the remedy.

Of especial concern to them were the bombings which have gone on in Atlanta and other Southern cities, outrages which no decent American condones. Javitts was especially concerned in this phase of Southern criminality and says he will make it a Federal offense.

All we have to say is that if he does, he may get some of his constituents in deep sorrowful trouble because there is little doubt that the bombings were the work of "planners" of racial incidents who probably live right in New York City and Southerners have nothing to do with them.

Not Religion But Principle Is Vital In Selection of President

WELL, MR. ROGERS?

(Indianapolis, Indiana, Star)

Attorney General William P. Rogers said in a recent speech that no public official has a right to defy decisions of the Supreme Court which interprets the Constitution. And every citizen, he said, has a duty to obey such decisions. We gather he was expressing the thought that when the Supreme Court has spoken with respect to the Constitution, its word is final. The same thought would apply to a lower court interpretive decision which is not carried to the higher court.

A Federal court in Minneapolis has issued a decision interpreting the Fourteenth Amendment which is intended to be binding on the Minnesota Legislature. The ruling instructed the Legislature to act on its 1959 session to reapportion its representation.

What happens now? The members of the Minnesota Legislature are public officials. Rogers says public officials have no right to defy the court. Yet for 35 years these legislators and their predecessors have been declining to pass a reapportionment measure. Suppose they still decline?

Is every member who fails to vote for reapportionment to be summoned into Federal court on a charge of contempt? The Minnesota Constitution, like the Indiana Constitution and like the United States Constitution, includes a clause providing that for any speech or debate in the legislative chambers no member shall be questioned in any other place. That provision would apply also, we should think, to the members' voting. A citation for contempt of court might not get very far.

Shall more direct and drastic measures be employed? Shall Federal troops be sent to St. Paul to form a ring of steel around the legislative chambers? Shall an armed soldier escort each member to his seat? Shall a resolution of reapportionment be impaled on a bayonet to be carried to the clerk's desk? Shall the members stand to vote with canted bayonets pricking their backs?

The Federal courts have the power to invalidate an action of a state legislature on the ground that it violates the United States Constitution. But that is a negative power, like the power of a governor to veto a legislative act. It is quite another matter for a court to order a legislature positively to take a specified action, just as it would be another matter for a governor to order a legislature to pass a certain bill. It is reaching even deeper for a Federal court to issue such an order to a state legislature.

Can a Federal court mandate a legislature to perform a legislative action? If it can, something new has been added to the American form of government.

Whether the Minnesota Legislature gets reapportioned, in 1959 or some other year, is Minnesota's business. But for the sake of the principles of republican government we hope the Minnesota legislators do not knuckle under to this court edict. If the court order stands, and if the 1959 Minnesota legislative session comes and goes without a reapportionment act, we will then find out whether or not a Federal court decision can be defied.

We defy any American citizen to get from any Washington agency a correct answer to the question as to how much American taxpayers were gypped by Roosevelt's Lend Lease, Truman's Mar-

Reuther's Next Assault Will Be On States With Right-to-Work Laws | ADA Audience Had To Listen To Facts They Don't Like To Hear

The State of Kansas adopted the Right-to-Work amendment to its Constitution on November 4 which makes nineteen States of the Union in which an American citizen is privileged to earn a living for his family without paying tribute to labor bosses.

However, because five states failed to adopt this amendment in the same election, Walter Reuther is feeling his oats and during the coming sessions of the various legislatures, it is rumored that he will send goon squads into the State Houses where it is already the law and undertake to bring about its repeal.

While no one denies labor unions the right to exercise their proper functions, the right of a man to join or not to join one is inherent and to claim otherwise is to infringe on the personal freedom of citizens of the American Republic.

In a free country it is incredible that there would be need for legislative enactments of this kind but such is the domination of Union Labor in this Land of the Free and Home of the Brave that the passage of Right-to-Work laws become necessary in order to keep this vast monopoly from riding roughshod over the rights of the people.

In these campaigns in the several State Legislatures money will flow like water just as it did in the campaigns of the various candidates for Congress in the National election since the Reuther philosophy subscribes to the belief that no man is without his price.

All good Americans are urged to keep a close watch on their representatives in the Legislature during the next session and give full support to those who oppose any movement for repeal of Right-to-Work laws.

TEXAS NOT HAVING ANY ANNUAL SESSIONS OF THE LEGISLATURE

Texas voters had to pass on a Constitutional Amendment at the recent election which would have provided that the Legislature meet every year instead of every two years and that members be given regular salaries of \$7500 per year.

The amendment was snowed under as it should have been. The legislature meets now every two years for a 120-day session and members are paid \$25 per day for each day they are in session.

In that short period of time, the law-makers have proved that they can think up enough silly proposals and do enough damage without being in constant session.

Those favoring the amendment advanced the argument that it would bring about the election of higher class men in legislative positions but we doubt seriously if it would have done so.

With rare exceptions, the American people seem to vote for the worst riff-raff on the ticket and send them to Washington and to their State capitals to make laws and we doubt that a raise in salary

INTEREST CENTERS ON WHETHER OR NOT ROCKEFELLER PROVES FLASH IN THE PAN

The regular Republicans in New York are claimed to be furious with Nelson Rockefeller for side-stepping the party organization in that State and pursuing his campaign for Governor with the assistance of professional Madison Avenue promoters.

Whether he will emerge in 1960 as a serious contender for the Republican nomination or will prove to be merely a flash in the pan like Wendell Willkie who was catapulted to notoriety and nominated through the same ballyhoo tactics of Madison Avenue professionals, remains to be seen.

For the good of the country, let us hope that he goes the way of Willkie and Dewey whose brief places in the sun were followed by total oblivion and eclipse of their political ambitions. Rockefeller is a far greater menace to good government than either Willkie or Dewey what with all his millions which

are being employed to Socialize the world.

If Rockefeller had been a real Republican, his refusal to have anything to do with the President and Vice President on their trips to New York just prior to the election, would be commendable. In that case, he would have wished to avoid the contamination of "Modern Republicanism" in his bid for office.

But the truth is that "Modern Republicanism" is not "modern" enough for Rockefeller. Where that philosophy of government goes most of the way into Socialism, Rockefeller goes all the way and falls overboard.

It will be interesting to see whether he puts his ideological beliefs to work on the New York economy or whether he is clever enough not to tip his hand until after he is safely holed up in the White House which is, of course, his long-range objective.

Not Important Who Conspirators Are, But Vital That Congress Protect Us From Them

Ever so often we receive a communication condemning us because we don't "place the responsibility where it belongs" for the conspiracy against the United States. Often there is implication that we are lacking in courage because we don't pinpoint the source of such conspiracy.

We never have, and never shall, designate any one segment, class or racial group as being responsible for the conspiracy to overthrow the government of the United States because we know that the enemy of Americanism is International Communism and that International Communism is compounded of many races, colors and creeds including some of our so-called best people in the fields of education, religion and politics.

To us the important thing is not who hatched the conspiracy against the United States. What is vital to our survival is that the Congress of the United States whose members are elected and paid fabulous salaries should protect us from any

and all conspiracies against us, regardless of their origin, instead of throwing in with the conspirators and furthering their plots to destroy us.

So our fight will continue in the future as in the past to be against Congress whose members, if they live up to their oath, will cause any conspiracy against the American Republic to vanish into thin air, regardless of who framed it.

We don't pay anybody else to protect our rights and freedoms. We do pay members of Congress to do that job, as well as honoring them with our vote and our confidence, and we have a right to demand that they make good.

There have been many conspiracies against the Republic since it was founded and there will probably be many more but such plots against us can only succeed when our paid public servants turn traitors and betray the American people into the hands of such conspirators.

would have made much difference.

Take members of Congress for instance. Their salary was raised to \$22,500.00 a couple of years ago on the theory that better men would offer for those jobs and look what we have to look forward to in the next session — a bunch of labor union stooges who have been purchased on the same basis as a housewife would go in a supermarket and buy a cut of round steak.

There are exceptions of course but let some good American try to pass a law through Congress curbing the goons and racketeers in unions and what happens to it will prove what we mean.

At the last election Texas voters approved an amendment to the Constitution providing for socialized medicine for old age pensioners and others totaling 340,000 persons. The Federal government will put up \$3 for each \$2 provided by Texas. The next legislature which meets in January will have to rustle \$8,000,000 from somewhere, the amount required to put the program over each year. It is a case of the Federal government getting its foot in the door in the interest of socialized medicine, a practice which is constantly spreading out over the nation.

Americans for Democratic Action recently invited Roy M. Cohn, former Chief Counsel of the late Senator Joseph R. McCarthy's Senate Permanent Investigations Committee, to address a gathering of that group.

It is rather difficult to understand why this invitation was tendered this particular speaker but at any rate it is claimed to have resulted in many red faces within the ranks of ADA.

"Your chairman stated in his introductory remarks that you are willing to 'tolerate' opposing views and I assume that I am supposed to begin by thanking you for 'tolerating' me," were Mr. Cohn's opening words to his audience. He continued:

"As in inviting me you must have known that my views are diametrically opposed to yours, I will dispense with the usual honored guest amenities and courtesies.

"I am unalterably opposed to just about everything for which you stand. It is the fuzzy irresponsible thinking of you and those associated with you which has contributed to the gains made by the atheistic Communist conspiracy in the world.

"Instead of militantly supporting Nationalist China as a bastion against Communism, you and those who share your thinking tried to tell us and the world that the Chinese Communists were different and merely desired agrarian reform. Through the influence of this warped reasoning on the part of the State Department and its satellites like the Institute of Pacific Relations, we deserted Free China and allowed the Communists to come to power . . .

On the domestic front you say you want to fight Communism . . . yet you are attacking just about any one who has fought Communism and Communist left-wingers . . . When the Supreme Court came out with decisions you didn't like years ago, your kind wanted to pack the Court and superimpose new Justices on the old ones. But when the Supreme Court today comes out with decisions that every layman knows are violative of the spirit and letter of the Constitution of the United States, you are all for the Supreme Court and bitterly attack those who dare to criticize it . . .

"Your activities have aided Communism, not fought it. There is no useful purpose to be served by your continued existence."

While it is certain that these forthright remarks made no dent on the convictions of the dedicated Communist sympathizers who make up ADA, it would have been worth a lot to have witnessed their reaction to having the truth hurled in their teeth.

A State Department official said in Washington that hundreds of "soldiers of the enemy" are traveling abroad on American passports, a privilege which the State Department no longer has the power to deny since the Supreme Court ruled in favor of Communists in the matter.

Negro With Long Record Speaks At Colored School

That colored schools are subjected to the same barrage of Communist propaganda constantly flooding white institutions of learning in this country is frequently demonstrated by such incidents as one which occurred in Houston recently.

The Texas Southern University is a Negro school there which is supported by State funds.

When the University's third library was dedicated in September, the principal speaker on that occasion was Dr. E. Franklin Frazier, Negro, professor of sociology at Howard University, Washington D. C.

A review of Frazier's record reveals that he has nine citations as having been connected with Communist front groups.

He is reported as having been affiliated with the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, cited as a Communist front; signer of statement defending Earl Browder; affiliated with Washington Committee for Democratic Action, cited as subversive and Communist by the Attorney General of the United States; sponsor of Mid-Century Conference for Peace, cited as Communist front; sponsor of Second World Peace Congress, cited as a Communist Peace Congress; sponsor of Stockholm Appeal Petition; signer of statement urging defeat of the Mundt bill; member of Planning Committee of the "National Committee to Repeal the McCarran Act" and Director of the Southern Conference Education Fund which is the new name for the old Southern Conference for Human Welfare.

There must be colored educators who are free from such affiliations who could have helped dedicate the library at this colored university but those who direct these matters usually managed to send such persons as Frazier to take part in school activities, both white and colored.

Smathers' Reply Is Worse Than No Answer At All

The lame and inane answer which Senator George A. Smathers of Florida made to Paul Butler when the latter indicated that those Southerners who do not believe in mongrelization, must leave the party is worthy of the utmost contempt of the people of the South.

Getting down on his stomach and crawling, Smathers predicted that the South would accept whatever platform was offered by left-wingers in the 1960 convention and said that he was confident that "if the platform committee drafts a reasonable and restrained Civil Rights plank, there would be no walkout by the South".

This was equivalent to saying that no matter what insults are offered the South in 1960, Southerners will take it lying down.

Smathers, thank Heaven, does not represent Southern sentiment as he is largely of the same calibre as Paul Butler.

The Ten Pillars of Economic Freedom

Editor's note: The basic principles underlying our nation's economy, have, in our opinion, never been so forcefully expressed as in these fundamental precepts set forth by the American Economic Foundation. Because most of us can improve our defense of the conservative viewpoint, we are going to run these Ten Pillars of Economic Wisdom for the next several months. Good as they are, **they might be even better**, and we invite our readers to make any suggestions that come to mind.

1. Nothing in our material world can come from nowhere or go nowhere, nor can it be free: everything in our economic life has a source, a destination, and a cost that must be paid.
2. Government is never a source of goods. Everything produced is produced by the people, and everything that government gives to the people it must first take from the people.
3. Government is never the source of valuable money. The only valuable money that government has is that money taxed or borrowed from the people's earnings. Government money created out of thin air by bank borrowing, dilutes the value of all existing money in the nation and places an unnecessary debt burden on the people.
4. In our modern exchange economy, all payroll and employment comes from customers, and the only worthwhile job security is customer security; if there are no customers, there can be no payroll and no jobs.
5. Customer security can be achieved by the worker only when the "boss" is allowed by the worker to do the things that win and hold customers. Job security, therefore, is a partnership problem that can be solved only in a spirit of mutual understanding.
6. Because wages are the principal cost of everything, wage increases, without corresponding increases in production, simply increase the cost of the goods and, in a short time, penalize even the workers who received them.
7. The greatest good for the greatest number means, in its material sense, the greatest goods for the greatest number, which in turn, means the greatest productivity per worker.
8. All productivity is based on three factors: (1) natural resources, whose form, place, and condition are changed by the expenditure of (2) human energy (both muscular and mental), with the aid of (3) tools.
9. Tools are the only one of these three factors that man can increase, and tools come into being in a free society only when there is a reward for the temporary self-denial that people must practice in order to channel part of their earnings away from purchases that produce immediate comfort and pleasure, and into new tools of production. Proper payment for the use of tools is essential to their creation.
10. The productivity of the tools — that is, the efficiency of the human energy applied in connection with their use — is highest in a competitive society in which the economic decisions are made by millions of progress-seeking individuals, rather than in a state-planned society in which those decisions are made by a handful of all-powerful people, regardless of how well-meaning, unselfish, sincere, and intelligent those people may be.

We started the paper on January first, 1950, on nothing and have largely kept it going the same way.

In spite of its limited finances, however, we think we can truthfully say that it has attracted nationwide attention and from the letters received, we know we have awakened many thousands of Americans to what is happening to them in Washington.

Our material has been picked up by syndicated columns and carried to millions of American readers; our editorials have been reproduced in the Congressional Record and have been carried in newspapers as far away as South Africa.

We are often tempted to quit and call it a day but, so far, we haven't. After all, it's not much fun working seven days a week trying frantically to make Americans aware of the danger to their rights and freedom when so many of them don't actually care whether the Republic endures or goes down the drain.

And it's not very encouraging to have rich men shower us with praise and then give their money to educational and religious groups who teach and preach Communism.

We have never in all the years gone in for the soft touch or delicate approach to issues we have tried to discuss. We haven't an iota of respect for those who are selling out the Republic to its enemies and it is not possible to show respect when you don't feel it.

If there are those who feel that we have done a creditable job for nine years under heavy financial handicap and who would like to make the task easier by giving us a contribution at year's end, we will be deeply grateful.

Ohio City Witnesses Communism In Action

How much more effective, if any, this modern method of campaigning is over the old way has not yet been proved, however. Knowland lost and Rockefeller won so it seems to be a draw.

Just how far candidates go in the future in playing pranks remains to be seen but the development of monkey-shines to a fine art is not expected to make any notable contribution to the nation's economy.

Whether a candidate rolls his way to defeat or eats his way to victory is not one of the major problems of the Republic.

Scatterbrained Eggheads Will Attack Filibuster Rule

The first damage to responsible and orderly government which will be attempted when Congress reconvenes in January will probably be an assault on free and full discussion of issues which come before that body now insured under the filibuster, a long-established institution in the American legislative system.

The next Senate will be running over with scatter-brained egg-heads who are imbued with the strong conviction that they know all there is to know and that there is no use for long-drawn out discussion of problems affecting the American people. If the egg-heads think certain legislation is best who are the taxpayers to deny their lordly claims?

The filibuster has been the shield and the protection of the Republic against ill-advised legislation for time immemorial but the lame-brain intellectuals are going to charge into the Senate in January like wild bulls from the pampas and try to wreck it and they probably will.

Triumph Without Glory, Victory Without Honor

In our opinion, the action of the voters on November 4 in dealing Republicans a resounding blow, was no tribute to the Democrats.

It was a slap at him for his undeviating loyalty to the United Nations and One-World Government and for sending billions of American taxpayers' dollars to Communist countries which may come back to us in the form of bullets and ammunition.

The tragedy of it is that no matter how the election had gone on November 4, or whether the ballots had favored the so-called Republicans or so-called Democrats, the American people would have lost in either event.

Under heavier Democratic majority now in Congress, the same brand of corruption will still prevail, extortion will still be committed against the taxpayers and billions of dollars will be squandered at home and abroad.

Regardless of the protest vote on November 4th which projected New and Fair Dealers to victory in alarming proportions the majority of Americans will vote Conservative when they have anything to vote for.
