Dear Sir:

Referring to my letter of Feb. 4, in which I mentioned that the gravel sidewalk around the entire property should be completed in advance of the dedication of the School for Nursing on June 19th, and, while under the Agreement this would fall to the City, in case they fail, it should be done by Mr. Wooding. I have not been advised as to the status of this matter and thank you to take it up with Judge Moore, seeing to it that this work is completed not later than June 15th.

The gravel walk between the buildings should be finished within the same period.

I take it the plan calls for a width of not less than 5 feet; that in passing around the pavilion and the flagpole the same width will be carried on each side; that at the gate entrance between the Street and the Sally Porte the opening will be the same as the Sally Porte; and that north of the building the same width will be carried for a distance around equal to the width of the Sally Porte and then reduced to the width that has been determined on between the buildings; that when finishing to grade, it will be crowned to allow for settling and some extra gravel left for filling in as it settles, and as the walk will be somewhat elevated above the ground on each side, it may call for building up with earth and sod before the gravel is distributed.

I am assuming, of course, that Mr. Wooding will see to it that the hedge is restored and the property cleaned up in advance of June 15th, a date that is now not very far off.
