Dear Mr. Belk:

In the agreement the City has with the Houston Negro Hospital Corporation, all public service lines are to be brought up to the property. The contract with the electrician on this building calls for an under-ground service run 20' up a pole at the Elgin Avenue curb line on the Hospital side of the street. The Light & Power Company has designated a pole on the opposite side of the street for the connection. This means that an additional 39' of pipes and cable will have to be furnished. I assume that the City will take care of this.

These cables cannot be spliced and therefore, have not yet been ordered. There will be three #4 wires, and three #8 wires with proper sized galvanized iron pipe for each case. May I ask that the City take care of this so that this work may go ahead at once?
