


**SHELL OFFERS COMMON HOLDERS RIGHTS TO
SUBSCRIBE FOR ADDITIONAL SHARES**

Shell Oil Company announced that it is offering to the holders of its common stock of record March 1, 1968, the right to subscribe at \$50 per share for 6,123,985 additional shares of common stock at the rate of one new share for each ten shares held.


The subscription offer will expire March 18, 1968, and, except as to shares issuable in connection with rights beneficially owned by Shell Petroleum N.V., will be underwritten by a group headed by Morgan Stanley & Co.

Net proceeds to the Company from the sale of the additional common stock will be added to the general funds of the Company and will be available, together with internally generated funds, for general corporate purposes, including capital expenditures. Shell's capital expenditures for 1968 are expected to exceed the \$619,000,000 spent in 1967.

Shell Oil Company, which is affiliated with the Royal Dutch/Shell Group of Companies, is an integrated oil enterprise operating in the United States. It is engaged in the exploration for, and develop-

WORLD'S BIGGEST CALF SCRAMBLE --- For those Refiners who could not attend the 1968 Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo and see a calf scramble, the photo above may give them a chance to see some of the action. In the scramble, held during every performance of the rodeo, 24 boys compete against each other and the calves. The idea is for 12 boys to catch 12 calves and the winning boys are then given up to \$200 toward the purchase of a dairy cow or \$150 toward the purchase of a beef heifer. The boys are required to submit monthly reports to their sponsors, the Livestock Show, and to their vocational agriculture teachers or county agents, and to bring the animals back for showing in the next year's Houston Livestock Show before the animals belong to them. Houston Refinery sponsors both a dairy and a beef calf.

This calf was the last one to be caught during the 1968 Houston Livestock Show but it is just the beginning for Steve. He will receive up to \$150 toward the purchase of a beef heifer of his choice which he must raise and bring back next year to be shown in the Houston Livestock Show.




