The tenth meeting of the fifth session of the Student Senate was called to order by President RICHARD POSTON at 8:30 in the Sonora Room of the University Center.

Senators CISCEL and SVENDSEN were present.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

The President announced that Gloria McAvoy resigned from the Orientation Steering Committee. She was unable to serve the first half of the summer and felt that she could not adequately carry on the job.

The President made the following appointments:

Don Stowers - Publications Board
Paul Bryant - Orientation Steering Committee
Jim Mazola - Orientation Steering Committee

President POSTON said that the purpose of this special meeting is to elect a Summer Senator and approve some appointments.

Senator SVENDSEN nominated David Shehorn for Summer Senator. Senator CISCEL seconded the nomination.

Zafar Taqvi asked if the Summer Senators were supposed to be elected by the full Senate. President POSTON said that the Summer Senate is in the place of the regular Senate. He thought it would be appropriate for the Senate now to elect the third member. Senator CISCEL said that they discussed the problem that the third Senator is not being elected by his constituents. "With a nomination and a second, this is tantamount to election. President POSTON said that for a group this small, Robert's Rules of Order are more of a nuisance than a help.

The Senators then voted to approve the nomination of David Shehorn as Summer Senator.

The Senate then voted to approve the appointments of Paul Bryant and Jim Mazola to the Orientation Steering Committee, and Flo Allen, Tom Koebernick, and Jim Strong to the Student Publications Board.

Truehart Willis and Suzie Jarrott were approved as nominees to the Organizations Board.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

President POSTON announced that the next regular meeting would be on Monday, July 22.

The President said that he would be out of town from August 4 - 17. He said that perhaps the chairman of the Fiscal and Governmental Operations Committee could chair the meetings if necessary.

Zafar Taqvi said that the President's Committee for International Problems will release their final report, consisting of about 65 pages, on July 30. The report covers all of the problems of the international student.

There was no further business, and the Senate adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
