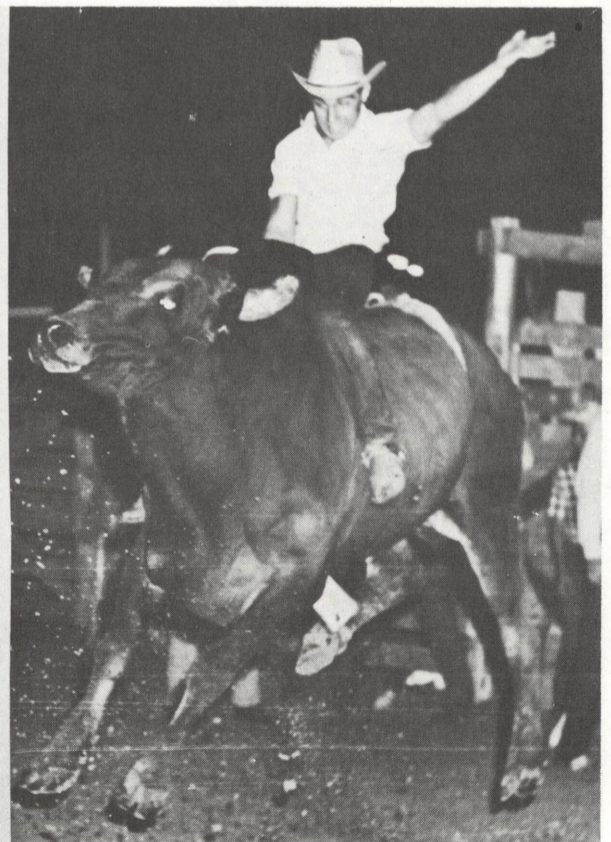

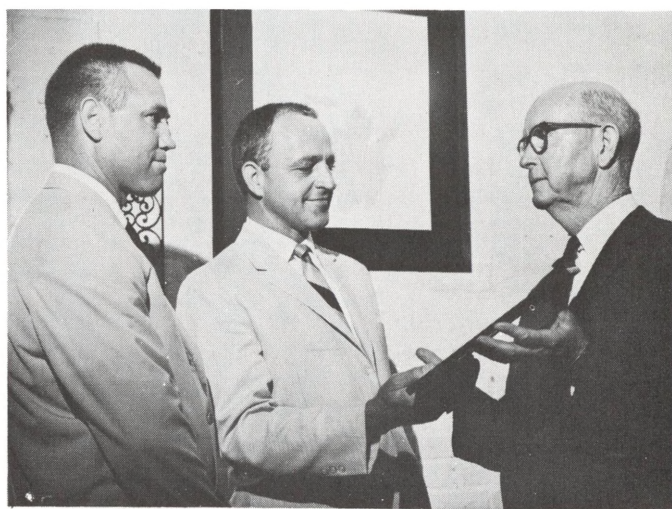

TEXAS CRUNCHY
 1 1/2 cups (6 ounces) finely chopped cooked ham
 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded Cheddar cheese
 3/4 cup chopped pitted ripe olives
 1/4 cup mayonnaise
 1 teaspoon chili powder

1/2 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
 12 slices white bread
 2 eggs, beaten
 3/4 cup milk
 1 1/2 cups corn flake crumbs

Fat for deep frying
 Combine first six ingredients. Spread six bread slices with mixture;

cover with remaining bread. Cut sandwiches diagonally in half. Blend eggs and milk. Dip both sides of sandwiches in egg mixture, then in corn flake crumbs, coating completely. Secure with wood picks. Fry on both sides in preheated 370-degree fat until golden brown. Drain on absorbent paper. Remove picks. Serve at once. Yield: 6 sandwiches.

PROBABLE PARTICIPANTS IN \$100 MILLION CAPLINE PROJECT ANNOUNCED YESTERDAY

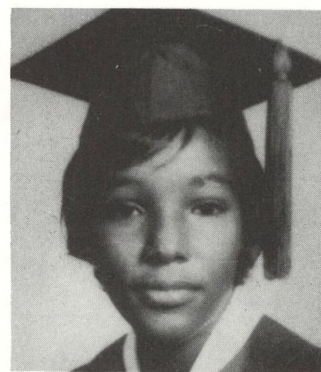

Known as "Capline" the announcement said throughput requirements call for a minimum 36-inch line and will be the biggest crude pipeline ever built.

The "probable owners" will be Ashland Oil and Refining Company, Clark Oil and Refining Company, Continental Pipe Line Company, Marathon Oil Company, Mid-Valley Pipeline Company, Shell, Texas Pipeline Company, Union Oil Company of California, Humble Pipeline Company, and Gulf Refining Company.

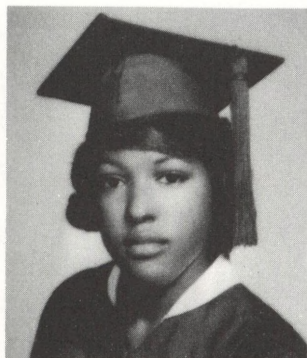
The announcement said "such a line will cost in excess of \$100 million and take two years to build."
