United States. In justice to these students, and as an off-set to the barrage of Socialistic propaganda which has been levelled at them since 1933 to sway their minds in favor of a paternalistic government in Washington, they should be provid-ed with accurate information proving that many of the chief operators of the Federal government for the past eigh-teen years have been master political crooks whose schemes for committing the perfect crime in the form of the Tidelands theft, have reduced the per-petrators of the Brinks, Inc., robbery to the status of small-time pickpockets.

Her name is Miss Birdie B. Steele Her name is Miss Birdie B. Steele of Kentland, Indiana, population of 1,608. She had read a pamphlet by Lucille Cardin Crain and Anne Bur-roughs Hamilton called "Packaged Thinking for Women" which showed how she had been made a fool of, hornswoggled into giving her proxy to women she did not know, to be exercised in a way she did not ap-prove for legislative measures she for legislative measures she loathed.

Miss Steele then began writing let ters. And they were hot. She ad-dressed them to Mrs. Buck, to other members of the Federation, to the newspapers and to Congressmen. She said she was disgusted with the Socialistic propaganda that was being fed to club women from a thought-control mill in Washington which was set up to further the aims of the State De-partment, of the Truman administration and of a scheming few who are out to destroy human rights by pre-tending to legislate guarantees of hu-man rights and to enslave the indi-vidual to the will of a Politboro under the guise of giving him protection of his freedom. You were told vaguely about the WJCC and the wonderful work it had been doing. You prob-ably were asked to adopt a resolu-tion endorsing their wonderful work.

You doubtless held up your hand like everybody else at the first roll call. It was affil-iated with the Communist-controlled CIO before the purge; with the Polit-ical Action Committee which has been cited by Congressional and other official reports as a Communist Front; with the Institute of Pacific Relations, now under fire by a Congressional committee and charged with subver-sive activities; with the National Urban-League, cited as a Communist front; with the War Registers' League, a Commie outfit developed during the Hitler-Stalin pact and with other set-ups singed or colored with Red Fasc-ism and/or totalitarian one-worldism.

By 1947 the outfit had films, speeches, speak banel discussion outlines and prefabricated papers to be read by lected members of clubs. Everyt Everything was worked out so that Joe Doakes, Mrs Joe Doakes, the Doakes children and the housemaid need never bother their heads to know what to think about national or foreign affairs.

Their thinking was all done for them about the Marshall Plan, on In-ternational Trade agreements, on the World Court, on water pollution, on a planned society, on socialization of medicine, on the support of Commumedicine, on the support of Commu-nist China, on relocation of displaced persons and on every idea which the New Dealers, Raw Dealers, Commies and "liberals" had ganged up togeth-er to put across. At first they had been shamelessly candid about the chicanery and duplicity of their tech-niques. They explained the means of blacking out avenues whereby an enlightened opposition might reach the public. They showed how to pro-mote their own writers and speakers, and how to plug pamphlets, books. and how to plug pamphlets, books, textbooks and club papers slanted in favor of Marxist schemes for dictator-ial power over "Democracy." This "news-letter" was conceived on the general lines of a gossip col-umn and dope-sheet on "inside Wash-ington." Not being a publication meant for the general public, it was a perfect medium for the dissemina-tion of falsehoods, rumors, wishful-hinking "urgdictions" "capotte from thinking, "predictions," the grass-roots" and "news" about the "pub "reports from e grass-roots" and unfounded ews" about the "public's" support ideals and measures favorable to the Commies, the one-worlders, the FDRists, the jobholders and entrench-ed bureaucrats in Washington. For ed bureaucrats in Washington. For instance, there would be a note about a "growing movement" among the grass-roots of citizens turning spy to ferret out "monopolistic practices" among friends and neighbors. Hell of a Way to Run a War

(From The FORT WORTH PRESS)

Never in history has an Army commander fought a war under more frustrating cir-cumstances and conditions than handicap General MacArthur in Korea. A powerful foe is throwing all it has

at him—and General MacArthur can't throw all he has back. It's true the Chinese Reds have little more than massive manpower, but this is particularly effective for two reasons: Allied manpower in Korea is limited. And the Chinese Reds are drawing on an inexhaustible source in an area we can't touch.

General MacArthur has overwhelming airpower, but can't use it to destroy Communist bases just across the border in Manchuria. Why? because he is taking his orders from the United Nations.

And the United Nations, so far as the Korean war is concerned, has deteriorated into little more than a debating society-which isn't even debating these days.

How can effective orders or decisions come from a discussion group which is split four ways: The Russian bloc, openly helping and encouraging the Chinese Com-munists; the nations, bellwethered by Britain, which have recognized the Peiping regime and want to do business with it, even admit it to the UN; a sizeable group apparently uninterested; and a U. S. delegation trying to play Happy Hooligan to all sides

wonder General MacArthur bitterly concludes that under existing conditions the Allied forces in Korea have absolutely no chance of winning the war from a mili- do so tary standpoint.

His hands are tied. He can't do a thing but hold on with all he has and trade punches indefinitely with the growing Chiese armies.

Never before has a military commander had a narrower field for individual judg-ment and decision. Every move he makes he must submit beforehand to an inert UN.

When General MacArthur confesses he is at the end of his tether, that he can do no more until "vital decisions" are made, what happens?

At Lake Success: U. S. delegate Ernest A. Gross says it is only an "analysis" that General MacArthur cannot make any recom mendations. Moreover, the U. S. delegation has had no instructions from Washington to ask the UN to let General MacArthur blast Red bases now immune. "Within a few days," the U. S. may present some ideas for steps to be taken against Peiping, but they'll be in the nature of trade restrictions.

In Washington: With President Truman in Florida, and Secretary of State Atcheson in Bermuda, assistant Secretary Webb declines positive comment, except to say MacArthur's appeal is "under General study.

Meanwhile, American casualties have reached 52,448. We're sending in more troops, but no other members of the UN have moved to increase their token forces in Korea. Nor is anyone pressing them to

States Have Traded Their Rights for Federal Grants

A refreshing and wholesome piece of legislation has been passed in the Texas Senate which would prevent the unrestrict-ed acceptance by State agencies of Federal grants

The measure, by Senator Ottis Lock, pro-vides that all State agencies and other political subdivisions must keep the legis-lature fully informed of their dealings with the Federal government by filing contracts for Federal grants with the legislative budget board.

Federal grants and Federal aid are the biggest threats to local governments today, in the opinion of Senator Lock who warns that if the present trend continues, the Federal government will be spending more to finance the State's activities than the State itself.

The passage of this type of legislation in every State would be highly desirable but the best plan would be for the States to quit taking any Federal money at all and learn to get along on their legitimate incomes. One of the principal reasons for the grad-

ual diminishing rights of the States is be-cause they have been traded off for Wash-

ington hand-outs and Federal patronage. A State which accepts money in return for surrendering its sovereignty, self-respect and independence is in the same class with a kept woman who is supported by a sugar daddy.

From the "Educational Guardian" published by the National Council for American Education: "That great American, the late Vance Muse of Tex-as, wrote this shortly before he died: "Many rank and file members of labor 'Many rank and file members of labor unions complain privately that the high priced leaders they employ to work for adequate pay and better con-ditions of employment devote too much effort to striving for personal political power and in trying to change our form of government. the more convinced I become that the Ne-gro has been grossly misled in this matter of integration and civil rights.

As a Negro, and an American, I naturalwant to see my race enjoy every right privilege and opportunity enjoyed by any other American, but I am opposed to any type of agitation designed to deprive the other fellow of a right to be associated with his own kind exclusively, if he so desires. I would like to reserve such a right for myself and definitely would not want it encroached upon by a Supreme Court edict or any other kind of interefrence. The right granted to one or two Negroes

in Virginia or some other Southern State to enter a state graduate school is of no benefit to the millions of our people who are in need of the bare necessities of life, and when the fortunately situated members of the race conduct campaigns of agitation for selfish gain, the needy masses suffer. No race or nationality in this nation has

excelled or equaled the Negro in educa-tional attainment and achievement, but this ducational opportunity was not only created by white dollars but has been financ white people throughout the nation. It is an unfortunate fact, that Negroes con tribute very little to their own commu-ity well being and improvement and this fact should be taken into account by these agitators before they initiate their program for demands in the field of education.

Instead of spending thousands of dol-rs to finance unnecessary court fights for privileges which will cost the race millions in lost valuable friendships and re-cial good will, our leaders should go into the Negro ghettoes and force the l grocer to carry prime meat and sell OUT people grade A products which will make is healthy.

I live in Newark, N. J., one of the supposedly liberal cities, and it is impossible to find prime beef or grade A cuts of any kind of meat in the Negro sections of the city. This situation is true throughout the United States. Grocers in Negro communi-ties carry the most inferior brands.

It appears to me that our leaders should

direct their efforts to correcting these abuses which are undermining our very existence. And these abuses are not practiced against us by white people alone; our own people are just as bad.

The Negro in New York, Newark and other supposedly liberal centers may en joy the privilege to eat where he pleases or go to any theater or public place of amusement, but a Negro can't get a license in Newark to operate a liquor package store, and there are any number of fields that he can't enter business in other eastern and northern cities. But this is not whites will even lend the money. Some of the largest contractors in the South are Negroes.

Northern Negro dollars spent to force southern white universities to admi groes will certainly not contribute to admit any thing toward continued good race relations in the South, and race relations were defin-itely on the improve until all of these school suits started.

I find more race prejudice in the East than I have found in Georgia or Missisppi. Two weeks ago ten tourist camps efused to rent me a cabin just outside of 'ittsburgh, and Pennsylvania is one of the sippi.

Our impluse was to go home and take an antiseptic bath and maybe feel a little removed from contamination.



In bringing about a shortage of this type of worker, the Committee has auto-matically forced their scale of pay up to a level where it will compare favorably with that of a bank teller, a university professor or a master plumber.

I was very happy to learn that, pending the time when household workers are organized into a strong union, the Committee has formulated this set of rules which they will undertake to have rigidly enforced by a proper governmental agency:

When a domestic employee comes in the front door in the morning at an hour which best suits her convenience, she should insist on being greeted by members of the family with the same degree of attention and cordiality expected by the current season's most popular debutante.

When being served luncheon by her mistress, she should not hesitate to point out any flaw in the service or fail to register complete disapproval if the quality of the food does not come up to her expectations.

She should make it clear, at the beginning of her employment that she must have one hour's undisturbed rest during the day, be permitted to entertain any of her friends in the living room who may drop by for a visit, have the use of the family car for any trip she may find it necessary to take away from the premises and be given her own private key to the closet where the liquor supply is kept. We doubt seriously that any who could ask such a question could understand the answer but it is very simple

In the Southern States we have always had, in the main, a type of color-ed people who are all in a class by themselves and are not like those in any other section of the country and up until Communist sympathizers got into the act, "racial relations" in the South were satisfactory to all concern South were satisfactory to all concerned

For the two races to be close and friendly was the natural and logical result in an area where the colored population was almost one hundred per cent of the domestic class and where any attempt at social mixing would have been as bitterly resented by Negroes as whites.

In this connection a story which is so ancient that it has whiskers force-fully portrays the attitude of Southern Negroes before they were infiltrated with the Communistic doctrine of "social equality."

Her hostess persisted: "I wonder why white people down South don't treat you like I do?"

"Ah don't rightly know" replied the maid, "unless it is because they is just naturally higher class folks."

And talk about "tolerance." No peo ple on earth have ever been more tol-erant than the white people of the South toward their colored friends or more charitable toward the frailties, weaknesses and little trickeries which have always been recognized and ac-cepted as a part of the general pattern of the race.

And in sorrow, sickness and death It is not to members of their own race that they turn for help but to their "white folks" knowing in their hearts that they won't be let down.

Eleven Ways to Ruin a **Strong and Prosperous** Republic

Mr. Charles Parsons of Kennebunk, Maine, a former trustee of Yale University and one of the most outspoken oppon-ents of New Deal and Fair Deal corruption in America has sent us the following eleven basic rules to assure the ruin of the American Republic.

These eleven rules were written by Dr. Curtis Nettels, professor of American History at Cornell University, considered one of the most outstanding historians of the country today.

Readers will have little difficulty, in the opinion of Mr. Parsons, in discerning the resemblance between them and the major lines of American foreign policy since 1945:

I. Assume a large part of the burden I Assume a large part of the burden of supporting two defeated states with a combined population nearly equal to your own. Act so that you will have to carry this burden indefinitely. Remember that the first straw, as well as the last, is needed to break the camel's back.

II. Nourish the enmity of a country with population of nearly 200 millions, and engage in a new "cold war" while the old war is still legally in force. Nothing will so effectively paralyze a republic as permanent state of war.

III. Provide immense funds to the allies of your presumed enemy in the "cold war." Grant lavish favors to states that are are pledged not to assist you in a war that may be precipitated by your favoritism to them. This will illustrate the principle of challenge and response, whereby a chal-lenge for cash is met by a response of folly.

IV. Select a few countries and tell the IV. Select a few countries and tell the rest of the world that your favorites alone are essential to your welfare, thereby no-tifying all others that you regard them as of no account. By this means you will make certain that you will have few friends among the nations and prove anew the truth of the saying: "There is no little enemy." enemy.

V. Subsidize a favored state on the ground that you are thereby resisting Communism, and do this while your favorite is encouraging the spread of Communism in an immense country like China. This will so bewilder and stupefy your people that they won't know whether they are coming or going.

VI. Subsidize a few foreign empires that discriminate against you in vast areas they control. Reward foreigners who in-sult and double-cross you, so that your people will feel that they are worms. This will devitalize the country and soften it for further foreign levies.

VII. Prepare to resist a presumed enemy by repudiating your historic policies and traditions, in order that you may serve the allies of that presumed enemy. Attack and vitiate your national sovereignty and independence, since — if asserted — they would deter you from the suicidal course subsidizing and arming foreign states that are pledged not to aid you in a major war. Deaden all sense of national interest, lest it prevent your embroiling yourself in a war for the benefit of those who are pledged not to assist you.

Good Old Arkansas

Scores A Home-Run

We salute our neighboring State of Arkansas.

Even though they may elect Fair Dealers to high State office, they have sent a man to Washington who is attaining great stature for his forthrightness and fearlessness in investigating corruption within the government.

Senator J. W. Fulbright has issued a long over-due challenge which should have been forthcoming back in the Thirties long be-fore the Arkansas Senator became a member of that body and when venal policies of government agencies first began to take shape.

It's "better late than never" however, and Senator Fulbright's Committee has done a creditable job in exposing conditions in the R.F.C. which are probably only a fair sample of what goes on in other branches of an administration which is devoted almost ex-clusively to the "social" welfare of the citizen.

The people, Senator Fulbright warns, are losing faith in the honesty of their govern ment and loss of confidence is as great a menace as Communism, in his opinion. Assurance of plain everyday integrity is necessary to keep down the belief that the entire government is corrupt, he adds.

Two Senate Investigating Committees have occupied the limelight lately and possibly both have been of benefit.

One is Senator KeFauver's Committee investigating crime in the underworld and the other is Senator Fulbright's Committee delving into crookedness on the home base. We feel that, of the two, Senator Ful-bright's Committee has rendered a far greater service.

Senator KeFauver developed information which, in the main, is not new to Americans who already were largely familiar with the situation, and his investigation has, so far, not made any disclosure that would have shown up an alignment between unde world leaders and top-level politicans in

Washington. Senator Fulbright, on the other hand, brought to light practices of corruption brought to light practices of corruption which led right to the White House but he let that cramp his style or slow him down.

Also, organized crime affects mostly those who put themselves in position to be affected by it, while organized corrup-tion in government touches every citizen in the land.

Those who lose money in a crap game, Those who lose money in a crap game, slot machine, poker game, faro wheel, horse race or what have you have only them-selves to blame and are gambling with their own money and on their own initiative. But when the R.F.C., for instance, makes a loan of millions to an irresponsible or shaky concern because some pampered pet of the administration gets a rake-off they

of the administration gets a rake-off, they are gambling with the taxpayer's money which he is compelled to lay on the line, whether he wants to or not, and, in most cases, under protest and against his will. We need more Investigating Committees

like that headed by Senator Fulbright.
