

NURSES HOME AT NEGRO HOSPITAL

A modern home for nurses and supervisors, as the second unit of the Houston Negro Hospital, was dedicated last Sunday afternoon before a large concourse of people, white and colored.

This plant, representing an outlay of around \$50,000, is another gift from J. S. Cullinan, Houston philanthropist and humanitarian, who also donated the money for the first unit of this local eleemosynary institution.

Under the original plans of Mr. Cullinan, he intends to make the Houston Negro Hospital the most modern, complete and thorough institution of its kind in the South for Negroes; hence the addition of nurses' quarters.

This new building is located at Holman and Ennis and will accommodate sixteen nurses and supervisors. It will also contain classrooms, a domestic science department, chemical laboratory and lounge room.

This gift of \$50,000 for the nurses' home and the original gift of \$80,000 for the hospital structure (the city gave two blocks of land for the institution) constitute a gift of \$130,000 from Mr. Cullinan for building purposes alone, to say nothing of flowers, shrubbery, landscaping and other improvements on the hospital premises.

Houston is blessed to have such a big-hearted character as Mr. Cullinan, who is making these contributions not for publicity and praise, but for the good of suffering humanity and to help the Negroes improve and help themselves.

The Negroes of Houston owe this donor and benefactor a debt of gratitude which can best be repaid by according the institution all the support and patronage possible and by doing all within their might to improve their living conditions and become better citizens from all angles.
