Other participants in today's contest will include those from business, governmental agencies and educational institutions.


IVY McMILLIAN DIES IN DODGE, TEXAS

Ivy D. McMillian, 69, died August 11 after an extended illness.


Ivy retired in 1963 as a truck driver No. 2 in Automotive.




JAMES, KARSTEDT AND PENNY ELECT TO RETIRE

Leroy James, 59, is retiring as wax helper, Lube C. At the time of his retirement, Leroy had 26 years of company service.




He and his wife, Sevelia, will make 8747 Guinevere in Houston their retirement home.




The executive committee members and solicitors for the refinery gather for a bus tour of various UF agencies on September 2.


