My dear Mr. Sinclair: In re: Hospital rating

Your letter of the 21st inst., received even date. I beg to advise that the committee on hospital rating and standardization are representatives of the American Medical Association whose headquarters are in Chicago. They make annual visits to the hospitals and the time that we expect them is January or February.

As regards the rating received by the local hospitals, perhaps I can better explain by sending you the blank which I received to fill out. These blanks come in each autumn. Our inability to fill them satisfactorily is responsible for failure to include our hospital.

As yet we have not been able to qualify for Intern service, this we must do before they will begin to consider us. There are some other points also necessary but the Intern is the major according to information given which I am also enclosing.
