Thank you for your recent inquiry about our courses in Radio and Television Engineering which has been referred to me for reply.

In reply to your question as to whether the University of Houston does accept Negro students, I must report that the matter of desegregation is currently a subject of serious study on the part of the University and its Board of Regents. To date no Negro has been admitted to the University of Houston, and it appears likely that desegregation at the graduate level will be preliminary to admission of undergraduate Negro students in such colleges as Technology.
