

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
MINUTES

The meeting of the House of Representatives was called to order at 8:30 p.m., November 21, 1960, by Carmen Stallings, Speaker Pro-Tem of the House of Representatives. The minutes were read and approved as read.

The Clerk called roll of the members. She read the names of the new members and they recited the oath.

The Speaker Pro-Tem called for committee reports:

Marc Grossberg, Chairman of the Monetary and Fiscal Committee, reported that House Bill #5 had been approved as presented.

Tommie Holub, Chairman of the Social Educational and Development Committee, reported that her committee had begun work on Cougar Christmasland.

John Perdue, Chairman of the Intra-House Committee, appointed Jack O'Wesne to his committee, rounding off that committee.

Old business was called.

Brenda Dietz made the second reading of House Bill #4. Brenda made a motion that this Bill be accepted by the House of Representatives. It was seconded by Kay McKee. A vote of the members passed the Bill.

Bill Hensley, Chairman of the Committee on Supreme Court Power, reported that the main power of the Supreme Court was to act as an arbitration court.

Buddy Horwitz made the second reading of House Bill #5. The Bill was approved by the members of the House.

Speaker Pro-Tem, Carmen Stallings, called for new business.

Harriet Waldvogel, Clerk of the House, made the first reading of House Bill #6 for the National Honor Society in Economics.

House Bill #7 was read for the first time by Clerk Harriet Waldvogel. Fred Doehring moved that House Rules be suspended so that the bill could be considered at that meeting. Clay Moore made a second. Kay McKee called for a division of the House. The motion to suspend House Rules failed.

The first reading of House Bill #8 was read by Clerk Harriet Waldvogel for the American Academy of Optometry.

Nancy Coffman, representative of Alpha Chi Omega read House Bill #9 concerning helping organizations get their earnest money for Fiesta. Lynda Moore made a motion that House Rules be suspended and that the Bill be considered at that meeting. Bill Hensley made the second and it passed. There was discussion. Bill Lipscomb, Sigma Nu, moved to amend the Bill, and that the money loaned be paid back by March 1, 1961.

It was seconded by Jane Buchannan. There was discussion. Clay Moore called a vote on the question. It was seconded by Buddy Horwitz and passed by a two thirds majority. Jim Boyd moved to reconsider the motion on the date the money should be paid back. Clay Moore seconded the motion and it passed. Clay called the question to delete the amendment and it passed. He then moved to consider the main motion and it also passed. House Bill #9 was voted on and accepted by House members.

Bill Bennett from the Social, Educational and Development Committee, made the first reading of House Bill #10.

Clay Moore moved that the meeting adjourn. It was seconded by Tommie Holub. The meeting adjourned approximately 9:45 p.m.
