Dillard calls for "new direction" at chamber meeting

Gary Dillard, the former General Manager at DPMC, urged a group of Deer Park business men and women to support President Reagan's economic policies and to "get involved" with the way the country is run during a recent speech in Deer Park.

"Do we have a stake in the program's success or failure? We have more than just a stake in it — we have a role to play," he said.

"When it comes to taking an active role in our community, our schools, our politics, we have become increasingly willing to let somebody else do the work. And then, when it doesn't get done right, we complain," Shell's general manager of logistics and manufacturing said.

Dillard spoke at the monthly Deer Park Chamber of Commerce meeting. The luncheon celebrated the chamber's annual Salute to Industry Day.

Dillard's speech, "A Look at the Past, A Look at the Present: America's New Direction," was addressed to one of the largest crowds in the chamber's history. He said a "new direction" was essential to solve the country's problems.

"We need determination, patience and selflessness to meet the problems that face us today. And they can be met. But only if we decide as a country — and as a people — to meet them," he said.

"It's so easy to develop a negative attitude in our society today," he continued. "No problem ever got solved until someone made up his mind that it would get solved. Not could be, but would be. And that means getting up and doing

"Firebird" airs on "Kennedy Center Tonight"

Journey to a mythical kingdom where magic overcomes forces of evil on next week's "Kennedy Center Tonight" program. The internationally-acclaimed Dance Theatre of Harlem will perform Stravinsky's "Firebird" on Wednesday, May 5, at 8 p.m. on PBS.

The popular "Kennedy Center Tonight" series was underwritten by a grant from the Shell Companies Foundation, Inc. The public television series is in the midst of its second season.

"The Firebird" is the story of a prince who captures the bird while hunting in the forest. The Firebird wins her freedom by giving him one of her magic feathers, with which he may summon her in time of danger.

The Dance Theatre of Harlem consists of 39 dancers who perform a repertoire of classical, modern and ethnic works. The multiracial company has toured Japan, Australia and Europe, and danced at the White House for the first state dinner of the Reagan administration.

New bridge slated to open May 6
