I of course did not know your complete plan until you sent me the skeleton draft of the matter for the tablet. I think the whole thing taken together is a noble conception, and surely this dead boy is fortunate in having so inspiring a memorial envisaging as it does the loftier American traditions of liberty to all and equality before the law, which in reality embodied the aims and objects of the young fellows who went to the front and gave their lives in order that this spirit might prevail in America.

I am glad to have been associated in even such a small way with this great project. I am not, you will understand, unaware that you yourself could have done the tablet just as well as I did it, but I realise you wanted me to do it and I thank you warmly for uniting me in this way with the memorial to your boy. It was a great pleasure to know the wording of the memorial as suggested by me pleased you. It seemed to please the artist, Mr. Barney, at Tiffany's and it was not very difficult to work it out from the skeleton you furnished.
