The Senate met at 7:05 in Oberholtzer Hall in Dining Room 2, and the meeting was called to order by the President.

The secretary called the roll and there were twenty-six Senators present and the Vice President with the following Senator absent: MIMI TRUEHEART

THE SENATE JOURNAL

Mr. GREENE of Arts & Sciences requested that his vote be registered as abstaining from voting on S.20 at the last Senate meeting (October 17, 1966).

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

President GAGHAGEN reported that a few copies of the *Faculty and Staff Bulletin* were available. More copies of the next edition will be brought to the Senate meeting for everyone interested.

The President announced that the President of the University of Houston, Dr. Philip G. Hoffman, will speak to the Senate after the meeting and the Senators will talk informally with Dr. Hoffman about any questions or problems they may have following a question and answer session.

The President reported that the Cabinet is complete except the position of the Director of the Department of International Affairs. The President also complimented the Committee Chairman on their Committee reports. The system is working out well and all Chairmen are turning them in promptly.

President GAGHAGEN reported that S.R.4 passed on October 10, and that he signed it the 19th. The resolution was then sent to Dean Yardley who was asked to take the resolution under special consideration. The resolution is now being considered by the administration.

S.R.5 was approved and signed by the President on October 19. Also, S.19 has been approved by the President and Dean Yardley.

Senate Bill 20 was approved by the President last week and by Dean Yardley on October 24.

Senate Bill 22 was approved by both the President and Dean Yardley on October 19. President GAGHAGEN announced the resignation of Mr. PENICK due to a conflicting class schedule. A seat in the Senate will now be open from the College of Optometry. This leaves a total of eight Senate positions available in the coming election.

Senatorial and Homecoming Queen candidates must file for positions by Wednesday, October 26, by 5 o'clock with a transcript plus a \$5.00 filing fee.

The President reported on the Dead Week bill. He was informed by a member of the Faculty Senate that the bill will be approved as long as it does not conflict with the required 45 hours class attendance. As it stands, the bill does conflict and the President recommended that a Senator to sponsor another bill to arrange for a shorter provision.

President GAGHAGEN acknowledged the presence of President Philip G. Hoffman, and following the adjournment of the meeting Dr. Hoffman would speak to the Senate and entertain questions from Senators.

COMMITTEE ON RULES & JUDICIARY

Mr. DRISCOLL, Chairman, reported that the Committee met at 7:00 p.m. The following members of the Committee were present: HUTTON, O'QUINN, COX, and DRISCOLL. The first order of business was the interview of Bridget Habenicht for the office of Election Commissioner. The responsibilities and aspect of the office were discussed with her. The Committee recommends un-animously her appointment.

The next order of business was the interview of David Kohler for the office of Election Commissioner. The Committee recommends his appointment un-animously.

The Committee next interviewed Larry Hawke for the position of Sergeant-at-Arms of the Senate. After the duties of the office were discussed with

Mr. Hawke, the Committee unanimously recommends his appointment.

The last order of business was the discussion of the absentees from the October 10th meeting of the Senate. The Committee recommends that Miss BRATTIS and Mr. GONZALES be excused, and Mr. ADAMS, Mr. CULPEPPER and Mr. PENICK not be excused. The meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.

COMMITTEE ON STUDENT LIFE

Miss TRUEHEART, Chairman, reported that the Committee met on October 20, 1966. Members present were TRUEHEART, CLEMENTS, EWELL, GONZALES, and LOGAN.

The Committee recommends favorably the appointment of Ira Greenblat as Director of Campus Entertainment.

The Committee interviewed persons interested in serving on the Organizations Board. After deliberation, it recommends that the Senate appoint the following:

Joe Cone - freshman law student who recently graduated from the University. Joe was very active in campus life as an undergraduate and the Committee feels that he will have the proper scope for a member of this Board.

Henry Allee- senior Political Science major. Henry has been active in student politics and affairs. The Committee also feels that he would make a responsible member of the board.

Cathy Sammons- sophomore Psychology major. In interviewing Cathy the Committee was impressed with her interest in campus affairs. She was president of her sorority's pledge class and is a member of the Special Events Committee of the Program Council.

Pam Wilson- sophomore Biology major. Pam was a freshman orientation counselor and is an AWS representative and a member of the Program Council. The Committee felt that she also would understand enough of the campus to understand in turn the scope and purpose of this Board.

Barbara Reidel - junior Elementary Education major. Barbara is a past Education Senator, active in Gamma Sigma Sigma, and a member of the Leadership Conference Steering Committee. Because of her experience in campus activities, the Committee agreed that she also would be an asset to the Organizations Board.

Senator HANCOCK requested that the Committee hold S.21 in Committee for another week because he has arranged for one of the psychology professors to address the Senate at that time about the need for and purpose of the bill. The Committee agreed to his request.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The first order of business was the approval of the nominations recommended favorably to the Senate by the Committee On Rules & Judiciary. After considering each candidate individually, the Senate voted to confirm the following people: Bridgett Habenicht, David Kohler and Larry Hawke.

Next the Senate considered the approval of the report on the Committee On Rules and Judiciary concerning the excused and non excused absences. Mr. SAXE of Education moved to accept the Committee's report. The motion was seconded and passed.

The nominations recommended favorably to the Senate by the Committee On Student Life were considered by the Senate. Ira Greenblat, appointed as Director of Campus Entertainment, was confirmed.

Mr. POSTON moved accept the portion of the Report of the Committee On Student Life concerning the five people recommended to the Senate for the Organizations Board, and it was seconded. Mr. WOOD moved to divide the question. The motion was seconded and passed.

Mr. O'QUINN asked which person was rejected by the Committee. Miss LOGAN replied that all six people were qualified but that Sharon Murphy did not have the amount of time available the other five had, so she was not recommended. The Senate proceeded to vote on each nomination to the Organizations Board individually, and the following people were confirmed: Joe Cone (18-3), Henry Allee, Cathy Sammons, Pam Wilson and Barbara Riedel.

The Senate then voted on the motion by Mr. POSTON to accept this part of Committee's Report, and the motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. HANCOCK announced the Committee On Educational Affairs & Policy would meet after the Senate meeting.

Mr. GREENE of Arts & Sciences announced the Committee On State, National, & International Affairs would meet after the Senate meeting.

Mr. CULPEPPER announced a Constituency meeting held on October 10, for the College of Engineering, and that 31 students attended.

President GACHAGEN announced the Presidents Forum meeting for October 28. He urged all Presidents of any campus organizations to attend to discuss any phase of Student Government. In the future Dr. Hoffman along with Dean Yardley may be able to attend these meetings.

The President also announced that the constitutional amendment approved last week by the Senate will go on the ballot for the elections Monday and Tuesday and encouraged the Senators to support this amendment.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. O'QUINN moved that the meeting adjourn. The motion was agreed to; and (at 7:55 p.m.) the Senate adjourned.
