The President of the Senate, Maury Corp, called the fifth meeting of the Senate to order. Penny Dunham gave the invocation. The minutes were approved as read. James Parkhurst was reported absent. The committee reports were as follows:

Lecture Series-Frank Lupo, Senator from Arts and Sciences, announced that Realph McGill would speak at the Cullen building on December 13, 1962 at 8:00 P.M.

Campus Affairs-Bob Bryan, Senator from Business, and Taffy Lamping, Senator from Education, read and answered the charges in connection with the Homecoming Dance. The Senator from Business also read a series of recommendations for future dances which would insure controlled conduct.

OLD BUSINESS:

Otto Crenwelge, Senator from Engineering, moved that the Senate accept the 1962-63 temporary budget as the official budget for the year. Joe Chiaramonte seconded the motion. There was discussion on the budget. Van Roll called the question and it was seconded. Motion to call the question failed, and discussion continued. Rick Harral moved that the Senate allow Richard Bass, Treasurer of the Student Body, to address the Senate. It was seconded. Motion passed. The Treasurer of the Student Body explained various areas of the budget to the Senate. Frank Lupo moved that Dean Johnson be allowed to address the Senate. It was seconded. Motion passed. Dean Johnson explained the importance of Student Government operating on an official budget. Joe Chiaramonte called the question. Van Roll seconded the motion. Motion to call the question passed. Motion to adopt the budget passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Milton Sowa read Senate bill number five. Kirby Boston moved that the Senate table all the monetary bills to be presented on December 10, 1962. Rick Harral seconded the motion. Motion passed. Kirby Boston also moved that the Senate meet December 17, 1962. It was seconded. Motion passed. The next Senate meeting was set for December 17, 1962 at 7:00 P.M..

Otto Crenwelge moved that the Senate allow Alan Segal to address the Senate. It was seconded. Motion passed. Alan Segal presented a resolution to the Senate which advised that the chairman of the monetary committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives meet every fourteen days in a form of a conference committee to co-ordinate views on monetary activities. Milton Sowa moved that the resolution be accepted, and it was seconded by Rick Harral. Kirby Boston moved that Charles LaMonte, Speaker of the House of Representatives, be allowed the address the Senate. It was seconded by Robert Peterson. Motion passed. The Speaker of the House spoke in favor of the resolution. There was continued discussion on the resolution. Kirby Boston called the question. It was seconded. Motion to call the question passed. Motion to accept the resolution failed.


Kirby Boston moved that the meeting be adjourned. It was seconded. Maury Corp adjourned the Senate meeting.
