'82 United Way campaign season kicks off

The annual United Way campaign at DPMC is gearing up for this season's fund drives. The kick-off rally begins August 30 and the drive continues through Sept. 10, but there are plenty of activities you can enjoy before that.

The Special Day's Picnic, one of DPMC's biggest events each year, will be held Saturday, August 14, at the south campus of Deer Park High School. The picnic begins at 10 a.m. and lasts until 6 p.m. Admission is free to all DPMC employees and their guests.

The picnic will benefit a number of local organizations, including the Houston Lighthouse for the Blind, the Baytown Big Brothers and Big Sisters, and the Pasadena Center for the Retarded. There will be beepball games, S.O.B. aquatics, the Special Day's Olympics, and even an art show by local artist Donna Caves. There's a number of contests, too, as well as a barbecue dinner. Advance dinner tickets are \$1.50 and dinner tickets at the picnic are \$2.

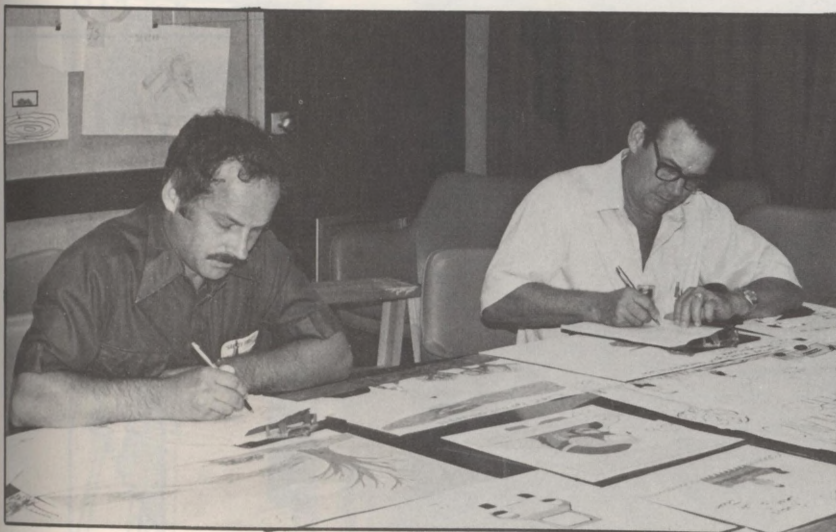
Paula Littles, DPMC North committee chairperson, explained that the United Way supports 83 different agencies in the Texas Gulf Coast area. "Our contributions are used to support local organizations representing a wide spectrum of services," she said. Last year, nearly \$180,000 was contributed by generous Complex employees.


