Dear Friend:-

I wrote you yesterday and mailed your letter which in all probability you will get today. But I had another matter that I wanted to talk to you about, and it is this.

My son Gentry Travis Powell in addition to campaigning this district for Governor Hobby he will be a candidate for Representative from the 74th Representative District.

In my letter of yesterday I asked you to let us have a good woman speaker for at least a week to speak in this district. It is my opinion that there will be "Women for Hobby Governor Club" organized in every County seat and in each voting precinct in these three Counties that comprise the 74th District. Now if possible let us have a speaker commencing immediately after May 25th, as that is the day set for my son to commence his speaking tour.

At present I don not know where he will speak first. But after I hear from you hear that it is possible to furnish us a speaker we will then arrange the dates which will in all probability commence at Kenedy and go through our District as far as Port Lavaca.


